He who he gives unto God calling
unto Mind the Mortality of my Body
and knowing that it is appointed
for all Men once to die I make
order in this my last Will, Testament
that is to say principally and first
of all I give and recommend my
Soul into the Hand of Almighty
God that gave it and my Body I
recommend unto the earth to be
buried in decent Christian burial
at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall
receive the same again by
the mighty power of God.

And as touching such worldly
estate where with it has pleased
God to bless me in this life I give
leave and dispose of the same
in the following manner and
from 1st My desire is that all
my outstanding debts should
be as soon as possibly collected
to pay of every just demand
against me And if there should
be more collected than is discharged
what legal debts I owe
the remainder to be equally
divided amongst my three children
William Moore James Moore Elizabeth
Moore 2^d I also desire that one
tract of land in Effingham
County containing 150 acres should
be sold and the money arising
therefrom to be appropriated
to the same use above
3^d I give and bequeath unto

my son William Moore the Lot and
Improvements thereon I now live
only be must pay unto my son
James One Hundred pounds & that
when he comes of age & the
same sum of One Hundred pounds
shall be paid to my Daughter Elizabeth -
when she comes of age -
4th I give and bequeath unto my
son James Moore my negro fellow
named Lannon and a farm lot
in Matham County containing
40 Acres which Lot I purchased
of William Mathews - 5th I give
and bequeath unto my Daughter
Elizabeth Moore one Negro -
Worm an named Jim 6th I do that
Moors one paid of gold piece
buttons one gold ring all which
were had Mathews 6th my desire
is that all the household
furniture should be equally

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divided amongst my three
Children William James & Elizabeth
7th My devise is for my son William
Moore to occupy the lot and
the other property till they
become of age And that he
must pay unto my son James
Twenty pounds sterling yearly &
every Year untill he comes of
age as an Interest for his
property And also the like
sum of Twenty pounds sterling to
his Mary and every Year untill
she comes of age as an Interest for
her property And also sum of eight
pounds sterling to be put to the use of
educating and cloathing of a
Daughter of her sister Anne
James & Charles And that
Eight pounds to be paid yearly
and every Year untill she dies
or comes to the age of sixteen

Means no longer 8th and if either
of my above three children should
die than there part of there above
portion to be equally divided -
amongst the of the line of Moores
And my desire is that the above
estate should be Intailed passed
on my three children William James
& Elizabeth and by their body by
Heirs And that no Marya person
should heid any part thereof
but that it should continue
in the line as above and their
body by Heirs forever & My
desire is for my son James to be
kept to school till he is fifteen
Years of age and then to be
bound for five Years to any
trade which he may like
best. And my desire is that
my daughter Elizabeth -

should be, continue with Mrs
Greenhow till death or marriage
separates them. If no husband
be taken and appoint my son
William Macie John Goldwain
Thomas Polk to be executors
of this my last Will & Testament
And I do hereby utterly disallow
revoke & disannul all & every
other former Testaments Wills
Legacies Bequests & Executors
by me in any ways before
named made & bequeathed
ratifying & confirming this to
be other to be my last Will &
Testament In Witness whereof
I have set my hand & seal
this Twenty first day of July
