Body Do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament that it is to say
principally and first of all I give and
recomm^{end} my soul into the hand of
almighty God that give it And my
Body I recommend to the earth to be
buried in a decent Christian manner
nothing doubting but at the
general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty
power of God. And as touching
such worldly Estate where with
it has pleased God to bless me
with in this life I give devise
and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form

I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth
Susan my nearly beloved Wife
All my real and personal Estate
(except one half lot in Reynolds
Ward) to hold to her during her
natural life, with power in
cases of real hereditaries to dispose
of part of such property which
will be necessary to afford her
a decent and convenient subsistence
Then I give and bequeath unto my
Son John Cable that half lot in
Reynolds Ward, to hold to him his
Heirs and assigns for ever with
this proviso nevertheless that it
shall not be his property while he
is lawfully married And while
that time his Mother my Dear
Wife Elizabeth Susan as
aforesaid shall for her own
use enjoy the Rents issues and
profits of the same

Then I give unto my Dear wife Elizabeth
Susanah All my personal property
Books Book Debts and other demands
demands due to me, and of which
she is to discharge all my just Debts
and funeral expenses, And after her
decease, the half of the furniture
shall belong to my Son John as
aforesaid, the other half of the
furniture she may dispose of
as she thinks proper.

Then It is my Will & desire that
after the death of her my beloved
Wife Elizabeth Susanah as aforesaid
that then my Son John shall
become heir to all other property
not here in part in early provided
for By this it is to be understood
that the half Lot, House wherein
I at present reside belonging to
myself by Virtue of a Deed

of life it is in her power to dispose
of the same as she thinks proper
I am And in case my son John
Gable should die without issue
lawfully be gotten then and in
that case my wife Elizabeth Susan-
nah may dispose of my real and
personal estate as she thinks
proper, hoping that she will
not forget my sister or her
legal representatives in that case
I am I give all my Tools and
wear apparel to my son
John Gable to be by him used &
enjoyed as his property immedi-
ately after my decease for ever
I am I do hereby nominate
constitute make and ordain
and appoint my dearly beloved
Wife Elizabeth Susannah Gable
and Mr John Richards to be
jointly to this-

my last Will and Testament and do
hereby wholly disallow revoke and
reannul all and every other former
Testaments Wills legacies bequests
and Executors by me in any ways
before named or intended, bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and
no other to be my last Will and
Testament. In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal
this fifteenth day of February
in the Year of our Lord one
thousand Seven hundred and
Nineteen.
