the principal & Interest the money due
on a judgment obtained against
Robert Henry Moore by the firm of
Messrs. Moore - I give
and bequeath unto Mrs Rebecca
Judah the principal & Interest the money
due me by note of hand of John
King for forty pounds sterling
for her husband's care and
attention to me I give
and bequeath to her Daniel
Gordon's nephew of my late
husband and my family Bible & Prayer
Book I give & bequeath
to Elizabeth the Daughter of

The said Council Goffe gave half
a Dozen More Table Spoons and
half a Dozen Tea Spoons

Item I give and bequeath
unto Jane Johnston Daughter
of James Johnston the my-
becoming apparel worth twenty
and the residue to be divided
among my Negroes Item all
the rest and residue of my estate
real and personal of what kind
nature or kind soever I give
Divide and bequeath to the said
Benjamin Thomson to hold to them
and their heirs for ever as tenants
in common Provided nevertheless
and upon this express condition
that if it should so please God
that my Dear Son John Goffe

should be living that they in
that case the aforesaid several
bequests to the said Owsen Thompson
be partially repeated so far as to
let in my said son John to an
equal distribution of my estate
both real and personal AND
lastly I do nominate, appoint
my said friends Owsen Thompson
Executors, Executor of this my
last Will & Testament hereby -
revoking all former wills by
me at any time made & Willing
whichever I have hereinto set
my hand & seal at Savannah
the fourteenth day of January
the thousand seven hundred and
Ninety one. ^{her} Jane. (Lasse) (L)

inhibited to by my clothes but
having altered my plan for good
reasons and let them take their
share in the general Division
they have fallen to my son
Benjamin I therefore give
Polly in their stead Suppico his
wife North and their three
children I have also added two
to Polly Lott of my Mother's to pro-
ceed Lott having been £90- less
than her sister Betsey according
to the appraisement made of them
Young Lewis £50- Susy £40. I
have also added to Sue Lott
a young Carpenter called Anthony
appraised at £60- I also give
and bequeath to my said
Daughter Mary all my House
