then I give devise and bequeath
all such my said real and
personal Estate, unto and
equally between such my said
Children as Tenants in Common
and not as joint Tenants And in
case either or any of my said
Children, shall attain his, her or
their age of twenty one years
in the life time of my said wife
then and in such case I give it
that the sum of One hundred
pounds part of such my estate
shall be paid unto such Child
or Children so attaining the
age aforesaid, And that such
One hundred pounds so paid
him her or them, shall be
considered as a part of such
their share or portion of.

and in my said Estate and Effects
And in case of but one Child
should live to attain his or
her Age of Twenty one Years
then I give after the death of
my said Wife All my estate
and effects unto such only child
his or her Heirs Executors
and Assigns And I do appoint my
said Wife Sole Executrix of this
my Will Dated this 27 May 1774

Testament of James Turner late
of the City of Bristol deceased
hereto annexed, was proved
approved and registered the
said deceased having whilst
living and at the time of
his Death goods chattels
or credits in diverse Exchanges

or Jurisdiction, By reason whereof
the proving and registering
the said will And the granting
administration of all and
singular the said Good Charles
and Credits, and also the auditing
allowing and final discharging
the account thereof are well
known to appertain only and
wholly to us and not to any
Judge or Judge; And that
administration of all and
singular the Good Charles
and Credits of the said Deceased
and any very concerning his
Will was granted to the said
Theresa Widow the executrix of the said
Deceased and sole executrix
named in the said will the
having been already sworn
by Commission well and faithfully

to administer the same and to
make a true and perfect
Inventory of all and singular
the said Goods Chattels and
Credits and to exhibit the same
into the Registry of our said
Court on or before the last
Day of July next ensuing and
also to render a just and true
account thereof
Given at the time and place
above written in and in the
eleventh year of our Translation.
