of the Parish of Christ Church in the
Province of Georgia do hereby make
being at present under the chastising
hand of God in a low state of Body
but thro' mercy of sound disposing
Mind and Memory make this my
last Will and Testament in full manner
and form as follows viz I command
my Soul into the hands of a gracious
God and hope for a joyful
resurrection of the Body thro' the
merits of my only Redeemer
Jesus Christ my Body I order to
be decently but not sumptu-
ously buried It is my Will
that all my just Debts be
only paid and of the remainder
of the Good with which I have
been endued I desire to be
divided

in manner following that is to
say I have and bequeath to my
beloved wife Sarah all my
personal and real and
personal of which I have become
separated by my marriage with
her as fully as if such marriage
had never taken place. Item I
give to my aforementioned wife a Negro
bench named Hannah with
the furniture of her body. Provided
nevertheless that on my said wife
die leaving her widowed then
the said bench and her furniture
to go to my daughter Anne and
in case of her death before she
comes of age then on my wife is
that the said bench and her furniture
shall belong to my sister Elizabeth
Valley and the heirs of her body
for ever. I am of giving bequeath

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furniture being said to be used
for the support of her self and my
children as hereinafter mentioned. And I
ordered all my House Goods and
other Property to be sold for the
payments and the balance what
ever may be to be equally divided
between my wife and daughter
and son. And by this my last will
and Testament I do hereby give
other I appoint my beloved
wife Sarah Parley my brother
Joseph Parley and daughter Susan
Sister and Executors of this my
last will and Testament. And I
should it please God that both
my children should die before
they come of age then I would
in the case it is my wish that
the money left them should
be and be kept to the use of
them and their children. And I
do hereby give and bequeath
all my estate hereinafter

I declare this to be my last Will and
Testament. I therefore do hereby
bequeath unto my hand and
my dear this twenty fifth day
of January in the Year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred &
eighty one and in the twenty
first Year of his Majesty King
