Bedstead, the Bed, bedding -
belonging to it -

I then I give bequeath unto my
son Joseph Gibbons a Negro man
named George a Negro man
named Kingston, two feather beds
four pillows, two a bolster, three
Mattresses, a Mahogany Bed
stead with curtains And also
my Silver spoons, Gold Sleeve
Buttons, I then I give bequeath
unto my son Barabaz Gibbons

40 and to his heirs a bequest for use
the remaining part of my be-
half of land purchased of Peter -
Bequest containing two hundred
acres more or less Also a Negro
Woman named Vanisher -
Daughter Van Also my Silver
Coffee pot stand, a Mahogany
Bedstead & curtains, two feather
Bed four Pillows, two bolsters
Three Maps a pair of my Maps
Desk. Also I give bequest
unto my Daughter Sarah -
Telfair a large loom quilt
and my japanned tea tray -

Also I give bequest
unto the Children of my said
Daughter Sarah Telfair a
Negro man named David and
a Negro man named York
to be equally divided amongst
them, if more than one But

in case it should so happen that
my said Daughter should depart
this life without issue or such
issue shall not arrive to the age
of twenty one years then and in
such case it is my Will and I do
hereby give & bequeath the said
two Negro Slaves to & among
my Children to be equally
divided amongst them

Item I give & bequeath unto each
of the Children of my said Daughter
Sarah Telfair three breeding Sheep
to be delivered to them immediately
after my decease

Item I give & bequeath unto
the Children of my Daughter
Mary Jones a Negro Man named
Prime & a Negro Woman named
Hagar to be equally divided
amongst them if more than
one Child in case my said

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Daughter shall depart this life
without leaving issue or
such issue shall not arrive to
the age of twenty one years —
Then it is my will and I do
hereby give, bequeath the
said two Negro Slaves to and
among all my Children to be
equally divided between them
Item I give, bequeath unto
my said Daughter Mary Jones
my Horse called Tom and my
riding Chair, harness —

Item I give, bequeath unto my
grandson Noble Winbury Jones
the use of my Negro Woman
Slave named Ninta for and
during the term of his natural
life, after his decease I give
bequeath the said Negro Woman
Slave to, among such of my
said Daughter Mary Jones's

Children as shall be then living
to be equally divided between them
if more than one. But in case
my said daughter Mary Jones
shall die at this life without
leaving any other Child or children
or such Child or children shall
die before he she or they shall
arrive to the age of twenty one
years then it is my Will, I do hereby
give, bequeath the sum of
Twenty five Dollars to, among
all my Children equally to be
divided. Item I give, bequeath
unto my said son John Noble
Timothy Jones three cows, three
calves, three head of breeding
sheep. Item I give and
bequeath unto my Grand-
daughter Rebecca Martin
Jones a small Mahogany
Chest of Drawers one foot high

three head of breeding sheep
and one half of my wearing
apparel. Item I give &
bequeath unto my son and daughter
Sarah Gibbons Jones, a fine hat
three head of breeding sheep &
the other half part of my wearing
apparel.

Item I give & bequeath unto
my sons Joseph, Baruch &
Gibbons all my table linen &
bed linen, kitchen furniture
& household furniture to be
equally divided between
them. Item all the rest
residue, remainder of my estate
real, personal I do hereby give
devise, bequeath unto my sons
William Joseph, Baruch,
to their heirs & assigns, & it is
to be equally divided
between them, share share alike

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I have and accept such of my said
Negroes Pamilla, Aaron as my
son William shall not make
choice of as before mentioned
the the Negro so not chosen by
him shall be sold by my Executors
herein after named And the Money
arising from the Sale of such
Negro shall be equally divided
between my sons all my Children
Lastly I do hereby nominate
Constitute & appoint my said Sons
William, Joseph, Baruch Gibbons
and my sons in Law Edward
Hoping, George Jones as Executors
the Survivors, Survivors of them
Executors, Executor of this my
last Will, Testament, here by
renewing all former Wills
by me at any time heretofore
made and declaring this only
to be my last Will, Testament
In Witness whereof I have

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now to set my hand to it at this
time in the day of January in
the Year of our Lord One
Thousand Seven Hundred &
Sixty
