sell the same Item I do give
unto the undersigned the

hundred pounds together with all my
rearing up here & the Dictionary of
English & French into my Cousin
James Clarkson of Wm. the tract of
five thousand acres of Land & fifty
pounds - unto my father in Law
Capt. David Wilson the hundred &
fifty pounds provided he makes
no claim against my Estate, if he
does then this sum / after deducting
what may be awarded him if
any / to go to the use of the poor of
the District of Southwark - unto
my Cousin Jane Clark daughter
of Wm. / five hundred pounds -
unto my S. Arthur Fullerton
fifty pounds to remain & continue
until he is of age - unto Aunt
Margaret O'Neil fifty pounds -
unto Miss Sally Cousin Margaret
Donaldson daughter of Arthur
fifty pounds - unto Mrs. Sally
Thorne for her personal affection

and duty to her parents fifty pounds
unto my Cousin James Schville
fifty pounds with a request that
he may be more attentive to his
business - Unto Mr. Deane Campbell
Major Twenty pounds besides
his Debt Unto the Pennsylvania
Hospital the prize of any that
may be drawn by the two -
Solomon Tichots - Unto Mr.
Arch. Brown the Embroid. Kit.
Patterns of the Silk Buckles Pattern
and Bag give unto Mr. Campbell
James Donaldson, Mr. P. Donaldson
Mr. Thorne, Eleanor Fullerton and
John Garritt, the sums which
they are respectively due -
unto me - I do request that if
Capt. Wilson has not provided a
Tombe Stone for my Mother -
I have (as I heard he had -
I hope for one) that a Gentil
one may be got as soon as
convenient and paid for before
any legacies are settled & paid
and if after all the legacies

and Debts if any are paid and my
Executor, allowed a proper compen-
sation for his trouble & fidelity in
the execution of his Office that —
should be any money or property
not herein disposed of left then
I desire that the same may be
sold and the money to go to the use
of the Poor of the District of South-
wark. But if on the contrary it
should be found necessary then
the deficiency to be made up —
from the several Legacies except
the House in proportion to the
sums they have left to them —
And I do hereby appoint Captain
William Brown of Southwark my
lawful Executor of this my Will
to do any other thing which in
the execution of his Office may
appear to be done in testimony
whereof I have power to set my hand
and seal the 10 day of April in the
year of our Lord 1756 & in the sixth
year of the Independence of my Country which
may God preserve
