Robertson & James Johnston Junior in case the above Ann Roche Marry me, this Property is to be divided to her in such manner as it can not be in any way her made over, but is entire interly, for her use to disseminate children, should she die before marriage it is to revert to Alexander and Daniel Robertson.

It is my wish earnest and best with that J. Relation off  
Schenectady Junior will stand up straight and advise Anna Kosche in all cases and  
endeavor to make her life as happy as possible.

May this my last will I inform J. Robertson of Johnston,  
one of my sons to see the above named  
sign in the presence of Sam Jones and Nathan Johnston, this 19<sup>th</sup> day  
of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eighteen Hundred and

order what shall be done therewith, and the legacy I am here ordering

I give to Elizabeth Hobell she to take safety Mitchell to live with her  
as she did with me, and no charge to be made against Mr. Hobell
