Brother John Johnson she left him in Europe, his heirs and assigns real
and personal, but I direct and order that Mr. Elizabeth Shobert be
permitted by my executors to come here in my house where I now reside
and keep the things therein of furniture time until my brother arrives and
order what shall be done therewith, and the legacy I now have ordered

I give to Elizabeth Shobert she takes Sally Mitchell to live with her
as she did with me, and no charge to be made against Mr. Shobert
