of the city of Savannah widow being of sound mind but sick and unable
in body to make this my last will and testament in manner and form
following first my sub^l I recommend to God my mother, my body I desire
to be buried in a decent christian^{like} manner at the discretion of my executors
herein after named.

I give to Sally Mitchell five hundred dollars to be paid to her on the day of her
marriage or coming of age say twenty one years old and the interest thereof
to be paid her annually after my death for her support, also one feather
bed and the furniture thereto belonging.

The rest and residue of my estate I give devise and bequeath unto my
Brother John or Johanna Hobell now in Europe, his heirs and assigns real
and personal, but I direct and order that Mr^{rs} Elizabeth Thatcher be
permitted by my Executors to come thither in my house where I now reside
and keep the things therein of furniture &c until my brother arrives and
order what shall be done therewith, and the liquors I now have on hand
I give to Elizabeth Hobell she to take Sally Mitchell to live with her
as she did with me, and no change to be made against Mr^{rs} Thatcher

further read the act of the legislature and hereby I do give my negro Boy Sam
 his freedom I appoint John West and Frederic trust my lawyers and revoke all
 former wills, to wit whereof I have been in my hand and seal this ninth day
 September in the said eight hundred and third
 signed sealed published and declared by the
 testator to be his last will and testament who
 in presence and in the presence of each other
 subscribed his name as witnesses thereto.
