It is my will that the negro woman Beck and her two sons Moses & Dick now in my possession be by my executors or some one of them returned unto my honored father & Mother or to the survivors of them, their heirs & assigns to whom I give and bequeath all my rights and titles in them or either of them.

Item It is my will and pleasure and I do hereby direct that all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal be sold at Public Auction to the highest and best bidder by my executors herein after named as soon as may be after my decease and as they shall deem most beneficial and advantageous hereby giving unto my said executors full power and authority to sell and convey all my estate both real and personal of what soever kind or whatsoever situated at such time and place or places as they may conceive most proper and to sign seal execute and deliver all such conveyances or other instruments in writing as shall be necessary to assure such property to their Purchaser, which property according to the best of my recollection is as follows my ware houses and lot known by the name of Campbell Tobacco inspection situated lying & being at Campbellton in the district of ninety six and state of south Carolina to be sold on a credit of three years payable in three equal installments

in so that the last payment be made at the expiration of the said term

Four of three years the purchaser giving and a most gage in the property
also my plantation situate lying and being an acre more or less in the Parish
State of North Carolina whereon I desire to be sold with the negroes belonging
thence viz. Ned, Samuel, Jack, Nann, Nanny and her child with the
horses, hogs, stock, plantation tools and implements whatsoever to the
same being or belonging on a credit of twelve months the payment of
which is to be secured by bond and mortgage on the property where my two
plantations situate of land the one situate in the falls of the Appomattox
river in Virginia near Fredericksburg the other situate lying and being
on the waters of the York river in county of York formerly in the county
of York and state of Kentucky near a village called Mount Sterling
purchased of one John Childers to be sold on a credit of twelve months my
executors taking from the purchaser a bond and mortgage on the property
from them It is my will and pleasure that all my bonds, notes, open accounts
and other debts due and owing unto me at the time of my decease be immediately
placed in the hands of some proper attorney or attorneys for collection and that
the same when collected shall be applied to the payment of my just
debts without delay and in such manner as shall be deemed most expedient
by my executors. I think it is my will and positive request that my execu-
tors do as soon after my decease as possible appropriate and expend all
the cash and ready money I may die possessed of to the payment of my
just debts particularly ~~to the payment of~~ those which I owe ~~in Europe~~
I think it is my will and earnest request that the money arising from the
sales, above directed as well as the monies arising from my debts collected, or
otherwise after the payment of all my just debts, be equally divided
share and share alike, between my two brothers Austin Sandridge &
James Sandridge, and my four sisters Suffer, Elizabeth, Nancy, Hannah
Winifred, Roxley, and Charlotte Sandridge, which proportions I do hereby
give devise and bequeath unto them respectively theirs. I a proper person
and I request of my executors to erect over one stone or Vault of handsome
marbles, which will point out to those who are interested by connection
or otherwise the spot where I lay interred, and lastly I do hereby nominate
constitute and appoint my brother Austin Sandridge, ^{James} and ^{David} Sandridge
and George Anderson of Savannah Merchants and James Fairchild of
