I Jane Thompson of the Town of Savannah  
being at present but weak of body but of a sound and disposing mind  
and understanding and considering the uncertainty of human life do make my  
will and testament in manner and form following (that to wit) I give and  
bequeath unto my son Samuel Kelly my two Negro women named Bess and  
Minerva together with their future issue and increase and also all such other estate  
whether real or personal as I shall die possessed of or entitled unto to have and  
to hold the said two Negro women together with their future issue and  
estate and all such other estate as above mentioned unto my said son his  
executors administrators and assigns forever but should my said son happen  
to depart this life before he shall arrive at the age of majority when it is  
with that all my said estate shall immediately after his decease go and  
become the absolute property of Peter Parker son of John Parker of whom  
I formerly acquire his executors administrators and assigns forever and lawfully  
have constituted and appointed the said John Parker executor of my  
will and testament and guardian of the person and estate of my said son  
Samuel Kelly and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my said son Samuel Kelly  
the only to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand at Savannah aforesaid the sixth day of  
November in the year of our Lord one thousand and seven hundred and eighty  
nine.

I, Diana Fikes for Maltese women living and in large lot of land  
apart from mind, memory and understanding I make my last will and testament  
in witness whereof following (that is to say) I give and bequeath unto my son  
and he and his heirs by the name of Thelma Thomas say all my personal property  
household and kitchen furniture and also the sum of five hundred pounds sterling  
of lawful money and I do give by the last will and testament of John Fikes  
of the said Maltese women I do bequeath unto Thelma say of the city of Savannah  
in the year of twenty one years then I give my said apparel furniture and  
my other things to my son Thelma say Maltese women who present residing at  
Savannah and I do give and bequeath unto Thelma say of the city of Savannah  
perhaps my other things such and her ten children Betty and Hannah  
together with their future issue progeny and increase and I do bequeath unto  
my son Thelma say Maltese women say sole executor of this my last will and testament  
and I do give and bequeath unto Thelma say of the city of Savannah  
all my personal property and all other things by me at any time hereafter  
to be made this only to be and contain my last will and testament. In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Savannah the first day  
of the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four  
the twentieth year of the Independence of the United States of  
America and I do declare by the said Diana Fikes  
and for her last will and testament in the presence of several witnesses
