I John Cash Livingston of the Island of Waupee, S^t. Luke parish
state of South Carolina being sick and weak in body but sound in
mind do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as
follows I give devise and bequeath unto my sister Mary Fraser three
hundred pounds, to Henry Richardson S^r. three hundred pounds,
to John Richardson three hundred pounds, to Richard Ash Fraser
three hundred pounds, to Miss Caroline Hammet Fraser three hundred
pounds, to Miss Harriette Fraser three hundred pounds, to John
Thompson four negro Boys and four girls from the age of ten
to twelve to be purchas'd immediately on sales of the government
crop. I also leave in trust to my friends Charles Odingles of
this state of Georgia and Francis Hopkins of the state of S. Carolina
to my wench Mays one half Lot in Anson Ward City of Savannah
and a negro Girl named Louisa, to Mays daughter Margan three
hundred pounds to be layd in a public fund the interest the interest
of which is to be draw yearly quarterly in case of her dying without issue
is to equally in same manner to Mays and the rest of her children. I also
give to Margan a negro Girl named Hester. I give and bequeath to
Paul son of Mays, Lydia Rose and Fatima daughters of Eliaz
four thousand pounds to be layd in a public fund the interest of
which is to be drawn quarterly and in case of the death of either of the
children to go to the survivors. I also leave in trust to Mays's Son Paul a
Lot in Anson Ward city of Savannah and a negro Boy named Toby.
Paul's proportion of the four thousand pounds to be draw from the fund when
he comes of age. I also bequeath to said Paul in trust as aforesaid a
farm Lot in Chatham County Georgia adjoining my plantation
containing fifty acres of Land I also bequeath in trust as aforesaid to
Mays daughter Lydia a negro wench named Mary and her child, to
Mays daughter Rose a negro Girl named Bye, to Mays daughter
named Fatima a negro Girl named Leah all the residue of my property
I bequeath to my nephews George Fraser, William Fraser, John
Fraser and Alexander Fraser to divided as they come of age. It is
also my desire, in this my last will and testament that my executors

last of emancipation of the 22 day of this month is carried into full effect
and since the slaves therein mentioned are not emancipated then the
whole of my property I bequeath to the parish of St. Louis for the
benefit of the poor, and I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Charles
Livingston and Francis Hopkins as executor as trustees to the said emancipa-
ted slaves and Charles Livingstone, John Bolton of the state of Georgia and
Paul Hamilton and Francis Hopkins of south Carolina my executors
to they my last will and testament hereby making and making void
all and every other will and wills at any time heretofore by me
made and declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand this twenty ninth day of
December one thousand eight hundred and three at Darfurker
Island state of south Carolina the word Cattle erased & the
word Paul inserted before signature
