Georgia. The last will of John Peter Kern late of the city of  
Savannah Merchant deceased declare by him by will made on the  
sixth and ninth days of September one thousand eight hundred and  
ninety six his last will and Testament reciting his dwelling house in the said city  
in presence of John Smith, John Henry Dubell, and George  
Hall of the said city of Savannah who have witnessed  
the same as appears by their several affidavits hereunto annexed  
which said last will was declared and acknowledged by the said  
John Peter Kern in the words following (to wit) I will make  
it shall give my sister I am so from Germany one half of  
my estate including etc three hundred dollars which I paid for  
my passage and the other half I will give to my two sisters as  
but one of them has died her husband I will only give her the  
one half her children have the money.

and to writing on behalf of his wife Sophie. There appears of course  
to have been Sophie the sister of the Trollope who first married him  
in 1821.

John. with of the City of Sacramento being duly sworn saith that John Peter Kern late of the said city deceased died on the sixth september instant, I being then very unwell say to this deponent I will make my will. I intend to give my sister which I sent for from Germany (meaning Miss Sophie Korn) then and at present of Sacramento one half of my property including three hundred dollars I paid for her passage and the other half to my two Sisters in Germany. but as one of them has a bad husband I will only give her the interest and let the money go her children. that the deponent therupon said, if the husband was a bad man he would spend the money and advised him also to give the interest to the children for their education to which the said Kern seemed to agree but was directly after this conversation taken very ill and died the 9<sup>th</sup> instant.

John Harry Denboll being duly sworn saith that on Monday the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September instant John Peter Kern late of the City of Sacramento being very sick deponent said to him that he thought he had better make his will. to which the said John Peter Kern answered that he intended to do it and said I will give my sister which I sent for from Germany one half of my property including the three hundred dollars which I paid for her passage and the other half I will give to my two sisters in Germany but as one of them has a bad husband I will only give her the interest and her children have the money that the deponent has been thought he had better say nothing about three hundred dollars he had paid for his sister's passage to which he answered I do so that after this Mr. Kern was very ill and continued so to be incapable to make his will at short intervals, that the time in which he died being Tuesday the ninth instant in the forenoon being there in his room he desired the deponent to go for a lawyer to make his will that the deponent accordingly went and

Mr. J. P. Korn came to the house of Mr. Horn but when they  
and he had eat of his meat and did about five o'clock in the  
evening.

Joseph Hebel being duly sworn saith that on Thursday the  
ninth day of September instant this deponent went to see Mr.  
J. P. Korn at his house that he found him very  
ill and apprehended he would shortly die that he told Mr.  
Korn his apprehensions who appeared in his senses and called  
the deponent by his name and said when the deponent so  
told him of his apprehensions never mind if I die my sister  
which is here will get half my property and my two sisters  
in Germany the other half and the deponent with that  
the said J. P. Korn died between five & six o'clock that  
afternoon.

In the name of God, I swear. I William Noyles of  
the State and County aforesaid, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life  
and being of sound and perfect mind and memory before the almighty God  
for the use to make and publish this my last will and testament in manner  
and form following that is to say, first. I will and direct that all my just  
debts, together with my funeral charges and expenses be paid as soon as possible  
after my decease then I give devise and bequeath all those my plantation  
or plantations with the buildings and improvements thereon situated lying and  
being on the Island in the state and county aforesaid and known by the name  
called Hutchinson Island in the state and county aforesaid, and having  
a grove of Poplar trees together with all and singular the crops and  
sites from the said estate or estates vesting in trust to my executors for the  
living persons named, I will and direct that out of the profits
