Mitchell Leguins of the other part I have made, John Maria and Margaret
my wife did for the consideration therein mentioned grant bargain sell release
and confirm unto the said William Stephens and David Prigrie Mitchell
and to their heirs and assigns forever all that Lots of land that I sell
in my possession known by the number two in the third of Tychemy Duke
ward in the city of Savannah aforesaid containing sixty feet in front and
Ninety in depth together with buildings improvements and appurtenances there
unto belonging To hold to the said William Stephens and David Prigrie
Mitchell their heirs and assigns forever upon trusts and to and for the use
of the said Margaret my wife for and during the term of her natural life
and after her death then the said Premises to be sold at public auction and

and the one half of the said purchase money to be paid to such person
as the said Margaret shall by deed or will lawfully devise or appoint
and in default thereof to her right heirs forever and the other half of such
purchase money to and among the right heirs of me the said John Storrie.
as to such person or persons as I may devise limit or appoint to receive
and take the same as by the said in part recited indenture of lease
and Release reference being thereunto had will more fully appear
Now it is my will and I do hereby direct the said William Stephens
and David Bryson Mitchell their heirs or assigns to pay all the said
half part of the said purchase money unto the said indenture of
release reserved and left at my disposal unto Archibald Clarke
the son of my said wife by her former husband to the proper use of
the said Archibald Clarke whom I do hereby appoint to receive
and take the same as by the said indenture of release is empowered.
And if the said Archibald Clarke shall depart this life before he shall
attain the age of twenty one years at which time and not before he shall
receive the said money (the interest thereof in the mean time however to
be applied to his use) then it is my will that the said half of the
said purchase money shall go to and be divided among my right heirs
of equal degree and their heirs and assigns and I do hereby give
grant and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my estate
real and personal movable and immovable with my said wife
Margaret and I do nominate constitute and appoint Thomas William
Stephens and David Bryson Mitchell Executors and my said Margaret
Curatrix of this my last will and testament according to the tenor
whereof by me at any time herebefore made I do declare this to be
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my

seven hundred and ninety three and of American independence the eighteenth.
