I Lewis Turner of the County of Chatham & state aforesaid planter being of
sound mind and understanding, considering the uncertainty of life and knowing
that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make this my last will and
testament in manner and form following, that is to say
first I do hereby order that my executors hereafter to be appointed do pay all my
just debts and funeral charges out of the chattels estate as shall belong to me
at the time of my death and which is not granted or given to any one by
this will and testament.

Also I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth Withing for her use and
benefit To hold to her during her natural life, The plantation on which
I now live containing sixty nine acres of land being in the State of
Wilmington in the county and state aforesaid she making no waste thereon
and after her death to descend to her son Lewis J. Withing together with my

eight and half I now possess
and further I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth Whiting the use benefit
and improvement of all the Negroes and other chattels estate of which I shall die
possessed of except a sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to my brother John
Turner by my executor year after year for during life.
And after the decease of my sister Elizabeth Whiting all the estate which I now
possess to be equally divided among my said sisters then surviving children,
together with the income of said property
And all the rest of my worldly goods whatsoever and whosoever after the
death of my said sister I give devise and bequeath unto them Mary &
Lewis Turner Whiting as aint above, to be equally divided among them
And if either of the said children should die without issue, the whole
of their portion to be equally divided between the two surviving ones and in
case they all should die without issue, then in that case all their shares
to be equally divided among my Brother Richard Turner's children then &
share alike except Lewis who is to have over and above the rest the third
of said on which I now live.
Lastly I hereby nominate my Brother Richard Turner my brother John
Turner and my friend Solomon Chatman executors of this my last will and
testament, hereby revoking all former wills or wills by me heretofore
made.

testament, hereby writing with my hand and seal this 16th day of July
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & in the twenty sixth
year of the independence of the United States of America

Griffith sole executor of this my last will and testament.
