brother in law James Robertson my portable writing desk and ten Volumes of  
Hume's works. And also give and bequeath to my Brother Andrew Johnston my  
gold watch. And I do devise give and bequeath unto James Robertson, James and  
Andrew Johnston and William Johnston all the remainder of my property both  
real and personal, in trust for my two children Elizabeth and James.

Thompson Johnston to be equally divided between them, when of age should and  
thereafter, or in the event of the death of either, then the whole to be given  
to the survivor when of age, but should it please the Almighty to take  
Both of my children before they become of age then I leave and bequeath  
to my respected father all my property real and personal to him his  
heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns forever.

And I do hereby nominate and appoint the said James Robertson, James and  
Andrew William Johnston Guardians to my said children Elizabeth and  
James Thompson Johnston and Executors of this my last will and testament.

a sheet of paper I do set my name and affix my seal this twenty second  
day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nearly  
nineteen.
