Mackintosh county, in the state of Georgia Planter, being residing in the city of
Baltimore in the state of Maryland, and of sound mind, memory and
understanding, but weak in bodily health, and considering the uncertainty of
this mortal life, do make, and publish this my last will and testament in
manner and following. First I order all my just debts and funeral expenses
like paid off with all convenient speed after my decease and as to all the real and
personal estate wherof I shall die seized, possessed, or in any manner entitled
unto, situate in the state of Georgia, or wheresoever else situate, lying and being
(save excepted such share and proportion of my late father's estate as I am entitled
unto) I give, devise, and bequeath one full, whole, and entire third part thereof to
my dearly beloved wife Louisa M^c Callister to her own proper use, benefit, and
 behoof sole disposal forever. I give, devise, and bequeath to my dearly beloved
daughter Louisa Caroline M^c Callister the remaining two thirds parts of all my
said real and personal estate wheresoever situate (except as herein before excepted)
forever, but in case my said daughter Louisa Caroline M^c Callister shall happen
to die unmarried and before she shall attain the age of twenty one years, then
I give, devise, and bequeath the said two thirds parts of my real and personal
estate as aforesaid devised, and bequeathed to my said daughter to my sister
Sarah Anne, wife of John Anne of Montgomery County in the state of Maryland
during her natural life and from and immediately after the death of my said sister,
then it is my will that the same shall go to, and belong to the children of my said
sister Sarah Anne in equal proportions share and share alike to their proper use
and behoof forever. And as to such proportion of my father's property as I am under the
will or otherwise entitled, I give, devise, and bequeath the same unto my two nieces
Famila Mary M^c Callister, and Matilda Maria Maria M^c Callister daughters of my
brother Archibald M^c Callister in equal shares, and proportions forever. And I do
hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Louisa M^c Callister and my nephew
George Washington M^c Callister, son of my said brother Archibald M^c Callister
executors and executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all
former wills by me heretofore made. And I do also appoint my said nephew
George Washington M^c Callister Guardian of my said daughter, desiring
nevertheless that she may be educated under the joint direction of my said
wife and nephew. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

sound mind and understanding, considering the uncertainty of life and knowing
that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make this my last will and
testament in manner and form following, that is to say
First I do hereby order that my executors hereafter to be appointed do pay all my
just debts and funeral charges out of the chattels estate as shall belong to me
at the time of my decease and which is not granted or given to any one by
this will and testament.

Also I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth nothing for her use and
benefit To hold to her during her natural life. The plantation on which
I now live containing sixty nine acres of land lying on the edge of
Wilmington in the county and state aforesaid she making no waste thereon
and after her death to descend to her son Lewis I nothing together with my
