I Samuel McFarnish formerly of St. John Parish Berkeley County, in the state of South Carolina, at present in the city of Savannah, in the state of Georgia physician, being weak with bodily infirmities, but of a sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

First, I will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as possible after my decease and to effect this purpose I desire that the debts due me in Carolina and Georgia be speedily collected and recovered: and in case this should prove inadequate to the full discharge of the said debts I further desire, that as much of my property as may be necessary to satisfy every lawful demand against me and my estate, be sold, leaving the kind of property that to be sold at the option and discretion of my Executors.

Secondly, I will and desire, that all my medical Books, instruments, shop, furniture and every articles appertaining to my Profession, be sold to the best advantage.

Thirdly, My just and lawful debts being discharged I give, devise and bequeath all my estates real and personal and every kind of property, I claim, own or possess in this world, unto Dorothy McFarnish, my wife, for and during the term of her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided between Emily Walton (daughter of my said wife) and Robert my son; and should the said Emily Walton die unmarried, I give and devise and bequeath my said estates and property to my son Robert, but should the said Emily survive my son then I give, devise, and bequeath my said estates and property to her the said Emily: and I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my friends Thomas W. Charlton, Joseph Miller & William Christie, of the city of Savannah, and James, B. Richardson, John Richardson, Elias Ball, and Doctor H. Richardson of the state of Carolina, Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills and testaments, at any time heretofore by me made.

And in case my said friends refuse to act, or discharge the duties here-
mentioned, I hereby empower, authorize, and request my wife Dolly
to nominate and appoint an honest agent, or attorney, to carry
fully into effect, this my last will and testament, who is hereby
vested with all the power that my said executors would have
if they had acted.

Lastly: I desire, that my soul may be received by that
being who gave it to me. In witness whereof I have in the
margin of the first sheet of this my will (the whole whereof in
two sheets) subscribed my name, to this second and last sheet
my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of September, at the
city of Savannah, and in the year eight hundred and thirty.
