perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling me unto the mortality
of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men so to die and ordain that my
last will and testament avoiding all other last wills by me that in my principally and
first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty God that give it and
my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent christian burial nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of almighty
God and touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this
life I give demise and dispose of it following manner after my debts being paid.
first I give and bequeath to my daughter Susannah now the wife of Samuel Thly
one negro woman slave called Judy with her female child Jubah and then if she
be my said daughter and her issue forever
also I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Francis and her issue to a negro
woman called Sarah and Dancer with their future issue also a negro boy called
James and it is my will and testament that at the death of my said daughter
Francis and all her issue that the said negroes with their issue be equally divided
amongst my surviving daughters.

I also give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Mary the wife of Thomas
Palmer one young negro woman slave called Peggy and a small negro boy
called Castrol and the issue of Peggy forever with ariding chain and shoes.
also I give and bequeath unto my loving granddaughters Anna and Clara the
children of my daughter Elizabeth, one negro girl called Sillah with her future issue
and that when it shall please to God to take either of these my grand
daughters out of this world that the said negro be the joint property of the survivors
the children of the said Elizabeth.

I also give and bequeath to my loving grand son Samuel Thly Jun: one negro boy called
shadwell but that if the said sam: Thly should die before he becomes of age and
has no heirs legally begotten at his death, the said shadwell shall be the
joint property of my surviving grand children.

I also will that the profits arising from all my certain Houses or tenements
lying in leased ground in the city of Savannah as the same may be collected
be equally divided amongst and between my daughters Mary Francis Susannah and
Elizabeth but that they do each of my said Daughters appropriate as much of the

and people in view from the said house as well as their respective children and as the signature of the certain house to know my said house stand my respective house after mentioned one to know the same if they can no longer as they think beneficial other wise to sell the same, and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided amongst and between my said daughters, Mary, Francis, Susannah and Elizabeth and further it will that at the death of either of my daughters the property left to her or them shall be equally divided amongst the surviving sisters and that when either of my said grand children shall die the property left to her deceased shall be equally divided amongst my surviving grand children for them and their heirs forever and lastly it constitute and ordains as a part of this my last will and testament my loving daughters Mary Palmer and Elizabeth Anderson.
