

To the name of God. Amen. I William
Shaw of Shireburn in the parish of Kirkbenton being of sound mind
and memory and considering the uncertainty of this life do make this my last
will and testament first. I give devise and bequeath unto my dear wife Mary my
House to dispose of at any time as she may of her almighty husband and taken
possession of my chair and horse.

Item. It is my desire that my executors hereinafter named shall allow to my sisters
Elizabeth Hunter and Lydia Elizabeth Hunter such support out of my estate
as they may deem adequate and proper, for and during the terms of their
natural life to be paid them respectively in quarter yearly, or such other payments
as may be convenient without material injury to my estate.

Item. I give and devise and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of
my little real and personal unto my said wife, and all my children that may now
be living, and such as may hereafter be born, to be equally divided between them share
and share alike each child to receive his, or her share when he or she shall
attain the age of twenty one years, or intermarry which ever first shall happen
and in case any of my said children shall die and or age, or before marriage
therein that case, I give devise and bequeath the share of such dec'd child
or children to my said wife and the surviving child or children to be equally divided
between them. but it is my will and meaning that the property hereby devised unto
my said wife shall not be subject to the debts or disposing of my future husband
but shall be and remain at the entire disposal of my said wife without the control
of my husband or other person it being my desire from the very great affection I have
for her to guard against her suffering if possible through life.

and it is my further will and I do most earnestly desire that my executors
hereinafter named do give my said children the best education in their power
and that my estate will afford, believing a liberal education superior to fortune
and the most certain means of making them respectable and happy.

Finally. I do hereby, hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint my dear
wife Guardian of the persons and estate of my said children and executors
of this my last will and testament, but in case my said wife should marry
then these appointments of guardian and executors shall cease and determine
except only that she shall continue to have the care of the children
till the date hereby designated the said children shall immediately after
the same to be married

the managing of my wife's affairs, & entirely and exclusively under the care and management of my executors hereinafter named, and further I do hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint my brother James Scoville and my friends Charles Jackson and George Jones, and the survivors and surviving of them, executors and trustees of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, and declaring this only to be my last will and testament contained in three sides of paper, and signed over to me by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two.
