and memory and considering the uncertainty of this life do make this my last
will and testament first I give devise and bequeath unto my dear wife Margaret
Hunter to be disposed of at any time as she may please all my household and kitchen
furniture and riding chair and horse.

Item It is my desire that my executors hereinafter named do allow to my sisters
Isabella Hunter and Lydia Elizabeth Hunter, such support out of my estate
as they may deem adequate and proper, for and during the term of their
natural life to be paid them respectively in quarter yearly or such other payments
as may be convenient without material injury to my estate.

Item I give and devise and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of
my Estate real and personal unto my said wife, and all my children that may now
be living, and such as may hereafter be born, to be equally divided between them share
and share alike each child to receive his, or her share when he or she shall
attain the age of twenty one years, or intermarry which ever first shall happen:
and in case any of my said children shall die under age, or before marriage:
then in that case I give devise and bequeath the share of such dead child
or children to my said wife and the surviving child or children to be equally divided
between them but it is my will and meaning that the property hereby devised unto
my said wife shall not be subject to the debts or disposing of any future husband
but shall be and remain at the entire disposal of my said wife without the control
of any husband or other person it being my desire from the very great affection I have
for her to guard against her suffering if possible through life.

and it is my further will and I do most earnestly desire that my executors
hereinafter named do give my said children the best education in their power
and that my estate will afford, believing a liberal education superior to fortune
and the most certain means of making them respectable and happy.

Lastly I do hereby, hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint my dear
wife Guardian of the persons and estates of my said children and executors
of this my last will and testament, but in case my said wife should marry
then these appointments of guardian and executor shall cease and determine
except only that she shall continue to have the care of the children,
but the estate hereby bequeathed the said children shall immediately after
the death of the said

the intermarriage of my wife aforesaid, be entirely and exclusively under the
care and management of my executors hereinafter named, and further I do hereby
annoint, constitute, and appoint my brother James Hunter, and my
friends Chas. Jackson and George Jones, and the survivors and survivor of
them, executors and executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking
all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, and declaring this only to be my
last will and testament contained on three sides of paper, and signed and sealed
