I John Baenwile Lmt<sup>r</sup> of the Parish and  
County aforesaid Planter being in sound mind and memory  
and calling to mind the uncertainty of Human life and for  
the peace and quiett of my family have made this my last  
will and Testament, I sell my Estate which it hath  
pleased almighty God of his great goodness to bestow me  
with recommending my Soul to God who gave it  
trusting to his Mercy in Jesus Christ my Lord for  
a blessed life of immortality in his Kingdom in Heaven  
My body to be buried near my Child Margaret by my  
executors after mentioned. — Item 1 order all my just  
debts and legacies to be paid as soon as it may be done  
to the satisfaction of my Creditors. — Item 2 — I give and  
bequeath unto my daughter Catherine Deveaux Son in  
Law Andrew Brandon Speddes Deveaux all that tract  
of Land I bought of Miss Gibson Wright, with one hundred  
of a pines tract of Land adjoining the ~~one~~ other laying  
upon being at Port Royal Island and fronting the broad  
River, where they now Plant to them and their posterity  
herself or her byes for ever. Also all those slaves I have  
delivered them long ago, with their spouses to them and their  
heirs for ever. Also one Maccinay Ring of my said Daughter  
Catherine — Item 3 I give and bequeath  
unto my daughter Ann Deveaux all those slaves with  
their spouses which I long ago delivered them Also that  
tract of land I bought of John Gordon called Parmenters  
with a small part of Scotts tract running through the  
fish pond to Mr. Thomas Wiggs land as the run by  
Mr. Doherty, unto my said Daughter Ann and Grand<sup>st</sup>  
Daughter Ann Deveaux and their heirs for ever —  
Item 4 — I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha  
Guerard all those slaves and stock of cattle which I have  
delivered her some time ago with their issue and increase  
Also one thousand pounds Sterling to be paid by my son  
John Baenwile at the death of my wife to the said

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Said Martha & her Heirs for ever — Item 5, I give  
and bequeath Amy Daughter Elizabeth Devaux all those  
Slaves I have — already delivered her with their issue  
with the Stock, also with the Money included in a Bazaar  
of Sale of Horse Island sold to her Husband & to her and  
her Heirs for ever — Item 6 — I give and bequeath unto  
my Daughter Bridget Devaux all those Slaves I have delivered  
from time ago with their issue. Also the monies that paid  
for the lot R. 4 with the low water lot opposite containing  
Sixty-one feet on the bay and one hundred and twenty to the low  
Water, to her and her Heirs for ever — Item 7 — I  
give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary the Slaves  
following by Name Samay, Tom Caesar, Cole, Henry,  
Little Rose, Phane, Rachel, Latoria, Pedro, Phebe & John  
her Child, to her and her Heirs for ever, to be delivered at  
the death of my Wife, Also that tract of land I bought of Mr.  
John Gordon Called Scotts, to her and her Heirs for ever —  
but if she should die before Marriage or without a lawful  
Hire of her body, then at the death of my Wife, the said Land  
to descend to my Grand Son James Devaux, son of William  
Devaux, to him and his Heirs for ever — Item 8, I give  
and bequeath unto my Daughter Phebe, Sarah, these Slaves  
by Name following Binah, Prosperity, Cupper, Hannah,  
Zyne, Jenny, little Maria Juno, Billy old Simon &  
Lizzy. Also that tract of land I bought of Mr. Ream Daniel and  
W. Daniel Blake on Ladies Island containing two hundred  
and forty-four acres lying next the tract my Father gave  
me, to her and her Heirs for ever — but if she should die  
before Marriage, at the death of my Wife to descend to my  
son John Bernis Barnwell and his Heirs for ever.  
Item 9 — I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter  
Hannah Devaux One Lot No. 70 I bought of Mr. Blackwood  
in Beaufort Town, to her and her Heirs for ever —  
Item 10, I give and bequeath to my Grand Son John  
Bernis Devaux One Negro Girl named Hannah Patti  
Child and her issue to her and to his Heirs for ever  
and I give unto my Grand Daughter Martha Devaux  
Daughter of William Devaux, all my Land at the Plantation  
called Scotts, with their increase — Item 11

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NOTE 11 - I give and bequeath unto my Son John Barnes my  
Island I bought of Kinnaway Norton Called Warsaw also  
a small tract of Pine land adjoining Mr. Andrew Goveaux &  
my Brother, also two Town lots near the Court house and  
Adjoining Blairs lot, and at the death of my Wife all my  
Lands on Ladies Island where I now live giving me by my  
Father & his and his heirs for ever with these Slaves by  
name following Isaac, Patis, James, Doway, June, Pompey,  
Lyus, Peter, Gloria, Affee and her four Children, Abram, <sup>SD</sup>  
Rose young Rose and her Child and their issue with all  
the Stock on the Island of Warsaw to him and his Heirs  
for ever. — NOTE 12, I give and bequeath unto my  
beloved Wife Martha Barnwell, my Dwelling house in  
Baptist Towne, and two lots W. 5 & 30 and the low water  
lot opposite ther and to her Heirs and assigns for ever also  
I give my Plantation on Ladies Island with the use of  
my lands I bequeathed my Daughter Mary called  
Scotts tract during her Natural life with all my  
Stock on Ladies Island also Bed, Plate &c. Also  
my Chaise, Chair and Horses and all my Stock of  
Cattle and horses on Ladies Island and half the  
Sheep on the Islands of Warsaw, with the Proofs of my  
late Plantation during my two youngest Daughters  
~~in~~ Unmarried State, also all these Slaves by  
name following, Winter, Joe, Major & Flora his  
wife, little Shmell, Patti, Betty, Will, and old Flora  
his wife, young Judith, Ryne, Sabina old Judith, Sam  
and old Nanny with their issue to her and to her  
Heirs, Also, big Shmell with my present ~~now~~ when  
~~she~~ dies, all my debts and legacies to be to her and to  
her Heirs for ever. — Lastly, I appoint my Wife  
Executor and my Son John Barnes Barnwell to be my  
Executor to this my last Will and Testament before any other  
all other Wills heretofore made pronouncing this and only this  
to be my last Will. Dated this twentieth day of November in the  
year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and twenty three  
Signed with my hand & Sealed with my seal

John Barnwell Test. (S.D.)

Codicil made by me and wrote with my own  
 hand this twenty-sixth day Novr 1773. in the  
 fourteenth year of George the third our Gracious  
 King, witnesseth the entitlē of my Estate, to wit,  
 if my daughter Mary should die before marriage  
 then my wife is her Slave to be equally divided  
 between her Mother and Phoebe Sarah; and if  
 Phoebe Sarah should die before marriage  
 then her Slave Jessie may be equally divided  
 between Mary my wife Martha and son John  
 Barnes Barnes, but if it should happen my  
 son should die before marriage or under age  
 then I give and tie my wife his Slave should  
 be equally divided between my wife Martha &  
 two youngest daughters Mary and Phoebe Sarah  
 and his Slave called Warsaw, I leave to be  
 sold, and the money equally divided among  
 my four married daughters Cassandra, Ann  
 Martha, Elizabeth and Bridget to them and  
 their heirs for ever his two lots and Pine land  
 on Port Royal Island to be sold and divided  
 so likewise and at the death of my wife I  
 give my lands my father left me, if my son should  
 die to be equally divided between my daughters  
 Mary & Phoebe Sarah she to have where my house  
 stands on south part, Lastly whatever my wife  
 should leave when she dies, nor Will, sole or joint  
 & delivered, before good & sufficient witness, hours  
 lots, Slaves, Stock, Plate furniture & of order to be  
 sold and the money divided among all my  
 children. And I do by these presents ordain impose  
 my friends Lewis Reive, John Barnwell Junr  
 Joseph Jenkins and William Waight to be witness to  
 seal and take equal commission to divide &  
 be the following signers

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December the eighteenth 1774 Whereas I have lately bought the  
Lot N<sup>o</sup> 4 situated lying and being in the Town of  
Beaufort off Richmonde Streete for the sum of 1445  
pounds money paid — I do by this Codicil give the  
aforesaid Lot N<sup>o</sup> 4 to my said well beloved Daughter  
Bridget Guevara, to her and to her heirs for ever —  
but if she should die without a Child and before her  
husband Husband, then my Will is that it shoulde  
descend to Mr. Richard Guevara and his heirs happy  
for ever — I also desire that what Money I shall  
make use of belonging to my daughter Phoebe  
Sarah may be paid her at the day of her marriage  
out of my Estate — Signed Sealed this fifteenth day of April

dispose of the same at her death and not  
before.

and John Williamson were witness and subscribed
