being weak of body, but of sound & disposing mind & memory &  
understanding, calling to mind the uncertainty of life am induced  
therefore to make this my last Will & Testament in manner  
following, after defraying the charges of my Funeral & full  
payment of all my just Debts, I give & dispose of my Property,  
real & personal as follows. Inprimis - I give, devise & bequeath  
unto my beloved Wife Eleanor, lately called & known by the  
name

name of Eleanor Patton all that Tract of Land containing  
seven hundred acres (more or less) lying in the district of Little  
Ogeechee whereon I at present cultivate together with the  
following Negro Slaves named Jacks & his wife Minty, Samie  
& his wife Betty and children, Prince and Tom, Will and his  
wife Pleasant, and their Child ~~Will~~ Will, Billy & his wife Bess,  
Adam, March, August, ~~Patience~~ Dorah & her children  
Hamblet, Deborah, Allick and Dick, Silvia & her children  
Jenny, Henry and Allick To HAVE and to hold the said  
Land, Farming utensils and Stock Horses and Negro Slaves  
aforementioned together with the future issue and Increase  
of the said females unto my said Wife Eleanor for and during  
her natural life, and from & immediately after her Death  
I give, devise & bequeath the said Tract of Land & premises  
with the Farming Utensils, Stock of every kind and Negroes  
together with the future issue & Increase of the said females  
unto my two children by the said Eleanor, called & reputed  
and known by the names of Eleanor and John Patrick  
Preaty to them and their Heirs and assigns forever as Tenants  
in Common Share and share alike. - Item - I give, devise  
and bequeath unto Miss Ruth Patton, Daughter of my said  
Wife - all that lot of Land situate at the Trustees Garden  
known by the Number six, and a negro Boy named Sandy  
To HAVE and to hold the said lot of Land & negro boy & any  
unto the said Ruth Patton her Heirs and assigns forever  
also the sum of One hundred pounds sterling to be paid her  
by my Executors herein after named in two Installments of  
Fifty pounds at the expiration of one and two years after my  
Decease, but in case the said Ruth Patton should die un

unmarried then the said lot of Land and negro Boy to revert  
to my said Children. — And Whereas I am possessor  
of a tract of Land containing three hundred acres situate  
in an Island in Savannah River near Purisburgh, —  
which I do hereby order and direct may be disposed of by my  
Executors hereinafter named either at Public or private  
Sale at their discretion to the best advantage of my estates  
and for the purpose of the maintenance and education of  
my said two Children. And all the rest & residue of my  
said Estate, real & personal of what nature or kind soever  
the same may consist of I do hereby give, devise & bequeath  
unto my said wife Eleanor during her natural life and  
after her death to my said two children, Eleanor & John Patrick  
their heirs & assigns forever share and share alike. —

And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my said wife  
Eleanor executrix and Richard Wylly, Esquire, executor  
of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all  
former Wills by me at any time heretofore made. —

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal  
at Savannah the twelfth day of November in the year of  
our Lord seventeen hundred & thirty two. —
