

GEORGETOWN In the name of God amen, This is the last Will
 and Testament of me Thomas Brownhill of Gatter
 County in the State of Georgia planter being very sick
 and weak, but of sound mind & memory, after payment
 of my just debts and the discharge of my funeral expences
 for the doing whereof or so much thereof as will
 extend to one hundred pounds \$100 I have sold and delivered
 to Nathaniel Pindilton esq. my Negro woman Slave
 named Molly, which Negro has been in his possession
 about twelve months, and for which the said
 Nathaniel Pindilton contracts to pay the aforesaid
 one hundred pounds sterling as valuable consideration
 for the said Molly, there is to say, to pay & satisfy David
 Murdock, the amount of my bond, principal & good
 Interest to him, for payment of which the said Negro
 Molly is mortgaged to the said David Murdock, and
 the balance for payment of my funeral expences
 and other debts if so much be required. And I
 do hereby confirm and make valid the Sale of the
 said Negro Molly to him the said Nathaniel Pindilton
 his heirs & assigns for ever. And I do hereby manumit
 and make free my Mulatto boy, son of the said
 Molly, called Daniel, and discharge him from
 all manner of Slavery and Servitude whatever
 either to me or my heirs, or any claiming under
 me or otherwise, but nevertheless request the said
 boy may be permitted to live with his mother, until
 he shall be of proper age to be bound out as an
 apprentice to some trade: I do give devise &
 bequeath unto my dear Son Thomas Brownhill
 all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate
 real and personal wh. ever the same may be
 found, to hold the same and every part thereof to him the
 said Thomas Brownhill his heirs, and assigns for ever.

and I do request my brother in law Nathan Standhope to take charge, and attend to the education of my said Son Thomas Brownhill, as also the said Nathaniel Pindleton directing them and each of them to apply my estate to the most Advantage for my said Son - And I do nominate and appoint the said Nathan Standhope and Nathaniel Pindleton Executors of this my Last Will & Testament - revoking all former Wills by me made In Writings whereof I have heretofore set my hand and Seal this fourteenth day of April One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty-Six Signed, Sealed and declared by the said Thomas Brownhill, as his Last Will & Testament in our presence, who in his presence and at his request, and in the presence of each other have signed our names -
