of my Estate be appropriated in the following manner
to wit - I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Margaret Buckineau the whole of my Estate a
Negro woman by name (ate my generation & all
Tattle and whatever monies might be due me - to be
disposed of at her own will and pleasure and I leave
my beloved wife Margaret my whole and sole Executor
to put this my last will and testament in Execution Signed
and Sealed and Witnessed this 25th day of June One thousand seven
hundred & ninety three & the seventeenth year of American Independence
