

Nuncupative Will.

State of Georgia.

Absalom Bull of the City of Savannah,
State aforesaid Gentleman; his Will by word of Mouth, made
and declared by him on the twentieth day of September ins-
tant a few hours before his death, in the presence of who have
hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses hereto.

My Will is that William M. Gale of the said City of Savannah
Practitioner of Physic, do sell or cause to be sold, as soon as
may be after my decease, all my Negroes to the best advantage
of my Estate, except my Wench Sireno, to whom I now give
her freedom; and request the said William M. Gale to
send her with my little son Thomas to my Father. Also
I request the said William to collect and dispose of the rest
and residue of my Estate in this Country, and vest the same
in specie and that he would transmit all the Money thus
arising from the sale of all my property, both real and
personal, to my Father Thomas Bull in the County of
Ulster, State of New-York aforesaid, to be by him equally
divided among my Children. - And also I call upon you
(meaning the witnesses hereunto subscribed) to bear testi-
mony of what I have said, and that I am now of sound
mind and understanding; and that it is my particular
request that Doctor Gale (meaning the said William M. Gale)
should take charge of all my property. Also I request that
I may be buried in a decent, becoming manner; and that
all half pay Officers to the British & Royalists may be desired
to attend my Funeral, and if consistent with the Laws and
Customs of this Country, that I may be buried under arms.

Independence of the United States of America, and in the
Year of Our Lord, One thousand, seven hundred and ninety one.
