This is my testament holograph and consequently
 my last wish, by this testament I disannul all others
 which could have been made. I institute by this my
 for my Exec, Testamentary, Universal Legatee Mr Anthony
 Gayle, who was born in St. Pierre in Louisiana, who has
 lived with me since number of years, & who has always behaved
 with the probity the most exact. I do

I do not understand that he should in any manner
whatsoever interrupt in the enjoyment of what
I may possess here in France, but St. Domingo
(in these two last places) of the case which happens. If
the French Revolution existing does not hinder
him or does not forbid him the means of so doing
all the above to the following conditions.

I give the freedom to my Negro Woman Lizette, and
give her for herself her 40 daughter Marie, ~~daughter~~
of her sister Francine, ~~in nursing to pay her to her~~
her sister Francine, when she shall pay to him one
hundred Dollars, but in the way to carry on a little
trade, that may enable her to get that sum. Geoff shall
advance to her fifty Dollars, which she shall restore to
Geoff with the hundred Dollars, for the purchase ~~which~~
shall make of her sister Francine. I give the
freedom to my servant Denis I make him present of
his infant Luis son of whom the mother is the negro
Woman Jeane. I give him also Regulone, his mother
Geoff will sell him also Jeane his wife, when he shall
consent to him the quantity of hundred Dollars, then make
him so to do Geoff shall advance to him fifty Dollars
which he shall reimburse with the hundred Dollars,
for the purchase of Jeane — and as my intention
in giving to Mr. Contraud Geoff is not to give him nothing
knowing that he will not purchase or make

way with any thing. Should he, he shall have an
 inventory made up of what I leave, & after his death, the
 whole shall be conveyed on the head of Mr. Caradoc the
 eldest son the head of my first daughter Dela Truitt
 the second daughter of my uncle Dela Truitt Rockwell
 after his death, that part which shall have fell to
 his share, shall return to the three sons of Mr. Caradoc
 Percival. As the Vachille, inhabitant of St. Domingo
 at present living in Carolina at some miles from
 Charleston. Moreover I have forgot will find
 amongst my papers a letter directed to him, which
 I beg him to send forward to him at Savannah

which my husband left is now pregnant with, ten young negroes
names as follows, And a young French Man Child, & a
Boy Prince, & Girl Prince by George, & Sarah, & Mary, &
by Mr. James, & Mary, & Child, & Child. To them & heirs
of their body, & of no such heirs beotten on their bodies,
to the heirs of those that may be then surviving, that
the aforesaid ten negroes, shall not be liable to be sold
