of St. Catherine, also my five hundred acres of  
Land, in the Company of the River, the  
Mill near Charleston in the State of Georgia  
to enjoy the same as myself, without any of  
my present troubling of him in the enjoyment.  
I further give him All the Money owing  
me by the Society which shall be applied  
in the good, as also the Debt due me by Mr  
Dr. Bridgman. If in case the said John  
Baptist Mark Michael Beck of the said  
Province, and residing, in the Parish of St. Philip  
in the City of New Orleans, was Dead.  
I request that my aforementioned possessions  
shall go, to the benefit of the Church of  
the said Province, to be used as I may  
now provision of Maine, to enjoy it as myself.  
Declaring me leaving thus whatever the Law  
authorizes me to do, in regard of all my real and  
personal Estate, in witness whereof I have  
signed the present in the presence of the Subscribers
