of the Town of Savannah, in the County of Chatham, in the State  
of Georgia, not being in good Health, but of sound Mind & Memory  
Blessed be God, therefore, do this day, to wit, the Thirtieth day of  
May, in the Year of our Lord, one Thousand Eighteen hundred and  
ninety one, and in the Fifteenth year of the Sovereignty and  
Independence of the United States of America, make publick and  
declare, this my last Will and Testament in manner following, that  
is to say:- Imprimis, I command my Soul into the hands of  
Almighty God, who gave it me, and my Body to the Earth from  
whence it came, in sure and certain hopes of a joyful Resurrection  
through the merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

And as for that worldly Estates wherewith it hath pleased God  
to enrich me with, I dispose thereof as followeth (that is to say) To  
first appoint all my Debts and necessary Funeral expenses to be paid  
immediately on my death, or as soon thereafter as convenient by my  
Executors herein after named. - I give and devise to my loving  
wife Margaret Richardson, all my Household Furniture, of  
which I have possessed. - I give and devise to my said Wife Margaret  
Richardson, All my real and personal property, to wit, a Lot  
of Land in the Town of Savannah aforesaid (which I now live on) con-  
taining sixty feet in front, and ninety feet in depth, situate, lying,  
and being in Frederick Street, Darby Ward, bounded on the  
East by a Lot the property of Mrs Sophia Young, on the South by Broughton  
Street, on the North by a Lane, and on the West by a Lot the property of  
Noble Wimberly, Esquire, together with all and singular the  
Buildings, and appurtenances there unto belonging. Also a Lot in the  
South west corner of the said Town of Savannah, late the property of  
the Reverend John Jonah Yubb, deceased, as also those five  
Negro Slaves, to wit, Ned, Rose, Anna, Jacob and Cappy, and  
the increase of those female Slaves, to hold to her the said  
Margaret my wife during the term of her natural life, the

24 making no spoil, waste or destruction therupon; and from and after her decease, I give and devise, the same real and personal Estate to my nephews, Thomas, John, Joseph and George, Sons of my beloved Brother Thomas Richardson, Butchers of Doncaster, in Yorkshire, London, their heirs and assigns for ever, share and share alike. — Item, all the rest and residues of my Goods, Chattels, Personal plate, Estate, ready Money, Rights and Credits whatever, except my working Tools, which I give to my beloved wife, nephew Samuel Peltor, son to Roderick Peltor of Charleton) after my just Debts and necessary Funeral Expenses as aforesaid are paid & satisfied, I give to my said Wife, to be disposed of as she shall think proper; And do make her my said wife (Margaret Richardson) sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament; Revoking all others heretofore by me made. In Witness, the said George Richardson have to this, my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal at Jessop aforesaid, the day and year aforesaid written.

forever. I give, devise and bequeath to my son William  
Read all those my two tracts of Land at Bryan Creek in the  
same Province, containing one thousand one hundred acres,  
to hold the same to him and his heirs forever, I give, devise  
and bequeath to my son George Padden Read, my tract of land  
in the Parish of Saint Andrew in the same Province, con-  
-<sup>amounting my tract of land containing five hundred acres</sup>  
taining five hundred acres on Canoochee River in the  
same Province, to hold the same to him and his heirs  
forever.
