 by this my writing purporting my last will and Tes-
 tament dispose of my Estate pursuant and ac-
 cording to the Authority to me given and Reserved in
 and by a deed of Settlement made before my Marriage
 with the said William Jones bearing date the
 day of August in the Year of Our Lord one Thousand
 Seven Hundred and Seventy Nine Between We the said
 Henrietta by the Name and Addition of Henrietta
 Bourquin of the parish of Christ Church in the pro-
 vince of Georgia widow of the first part and the
 said William Jones by the Name and Addition of William
 Jones of Savannah in the said province Attorney at
 Law of the second part and John Fox by the Name
 and Addition of John Fox of the parish of Christ
 Church of the third part and by Virtue of the said
 deed and all other powers and Authorities what-
 soever to me given and Reserved in consequence
 thereof in manner as follows First I give
 and Give to my Husband the said William Jones
 for and during the Term of his Natural Life one third
 part of all the yearly Rents Issues profits and produce
 of my Estate both real and personal and the other
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Two Thirds the whole to be divided in three parts of
all the yearly Rents Issues profits and produce of
all my Said Estate I give and devise to my Sisters
Jane Judith Bourquin Catharine Rhen and Frances
Joy to be equally divided among them during the
Term of their Natural lives and the Life of the Survivor
of them but it is my express Will and desire that
the dividend coming to the Said Catharine Rhen is
to be paid to her Alone for her sole Use and benefit with-
out any control of her Husband Also I give and devise
after the decease of my Said Husband William Jones
and my Said Sisters Jane Judith Bourquin Catharine
Rhen and Frances Joy To William Henry Bourquin
Son of Colonel John Lewis Bourquin of South Carolina
and the Heirs of his Body lawfully begotten for ever
all that my Lot of Land in the Town of Savannah
in Georgia adjacent with the Houses and Buildings
thereon but in Case of the Death of the Said William
Henry Bourquin without Heirs of his Body lawfully
begotten then in such Case I give and devise the large
House on the Said Lot of Land and the proportion of
the Said Lot of Land belonging thereto to my Nephew
Jacob Waldinger of Savannah Georgia Attorney at Law
his Heirs and Assigns for ever and the small House
on the Said Lot of Land belonging thereto I give and
Devise to Henry Bourquin Son of my Nephew Henry
Bourquin of Little Quebec in Georgia for his Heirs
and Assigns for ever Also I give and Devise after
the decease of my Said Husband and my Said
three

These Sisters To John Bourquin Junr Son of the Said
 John Lewis Bourquin and Sophia Bane the Wife of
 John of South Carolina planter Three Negroe
 Slaves Named George Tom and Ace to be divided be-
 tween them and their Heirs for ever Also I give
 and devise after the decease of my Said Husband
 and Three Sisters To Mary White of Little Ogeechee Spmt
 the Sum of Twenty five pounds to be paid to her alone
 out of the Rents and produce of my Estate Also I
 give and devise after the decease of my Said Husband
 and my Said Three Sisters one fourth part of all the
 Real Estate and Remainder of my Said Estate
 both Real and personal to the Said Jacob Waldburger
 his Heirs and Assigns for ever and other fourth part
 of all the Real Estate and Remainder of my Said Estate
 the Negroe Girl Named Betty to be included after the
 decease of my Said Husband and my Said three
 Sisters I give and devise to my Niece Cornelia
 Washburn her Heirs and Assigns for ever Also
 I give and devise after the decease of my Said Hus-
 band and my Said Three Sisters The two Remain-
 ing fourth part of my Said Estate to my Nephews
 John Lewis Reed John Fox and Bartholomey
 Waldburger and my Niece Mary Wisk Wife of
 John Wisk of South Carolina planter equally to
 be divided between them their Heirs and Assigns for
 ever But in case of the death of the Said John
 Fox without Issue Lawfully Begotten them and in

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Georgia) Before me Edward White Clerk of the Court
of Ordinary for the County of Chatham in the State
of Georgia appeared George Haist of the City of
Savannah who being duly Sworn Saith that the Signature
of George Haist at the foot of the Annexed last Will
and Testament of Henrietta B. Jones deceased Dated
The Twelfth Day of August One Thousand Seven Hundred
and Eighty Eight as written to the same is his the
Deponent's proper hand writing And that he cannot pos-
sibly recollect the persons of James Torner and Mary
Ambrose the other two Subscribing Witnesses yet he
well remembers that at about the time of the Date of
the above Will that Mrs. Henrietta B. Jones the Tes-
tatrix was in England and frequently at the Depo-
nent's House and from every Circumstance he the Depo-
nent believes that the foregoing Annexed Last Will and
Testament was as fully and Ampley executed as is Usual
and that he well believes the same to be in the hand
writing of William Jones deceased the then Husband
of the said Henrietta B. Jones the Testatrix -

Ordinary for said County John Young Mace Attorney
at Law residing in the City of Savannah who
being duly Sworn Deposeth and Saith that he is
well acquainted with the hand writing of Mrs
Abigail B. Jones late of New Providence now deceased
and that he truly believes the Signature to the Instru-
ment of Writing hereto annexed to be the hand writing
of the said Ab. B. Jones and this Deponent further
Saith that in the Month of May in the Year seventeen
Hundred and Ninety four some Days after Mrs. Ab. B.
Jones had appointed this Deponent her Attorney in
Fact respecting her Affairs in Georgia by a Letter
of Attorney duly executed she delivered to this Depone-
nt the Annexed Instrument of Writing Sealed up
and informed him that it was her last Will and Tes-
tament and at the same Time requested him to take
Charge of preserving it ... And this Deponent Saith
that the Paper remained in his possession Sealed up
until the Death of Mrs. Jones that this Deponent
made it known to every person whom he supposed
to be related to Mrs. Jones or interested in her
Affairs that such papers remained in his posses-
sion ... That after her death no particularly En-
quiring nor any Request to have the paper opened
was made until ... His Honor Esquire and
some other person who this Deponent believes was
Bartholomew Waldburger Esquire called on this

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This report regarding to see to that accordingly
the box was broken open in their presence and
the instrument was perused by those gentlemen
who returned to this report that the depo-
nent kept possession of it no person calling on
him for it or attempting to cut upon it. On the
day of May last when it was taken out of
his possession by Zachariah Hawkins esquire and
deposited in the Clerk's Office of the Court of
Ordinary
