both real & personal whatsoever and whosoever which I may
die possessed of - And I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint
John Whitley of the City of Savannah, Butcher, to be Executor
of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking and making
void all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore
made and declaring this only to be my last Will & Testament

my Hand & Seal at Savannah in the said State of Georgia the tenth
day of September in the year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred
and ninety two & of American Independence the seventeenth. -
