be possessed of - And I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint
John Whistler of the City of Savannah, Butcher, to be Executor
of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking and making
void all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore
made and declaring this only to be my last Will & Testament
In witness whereof the said John Bell have hereunto set
my hand & seal at Savannah in the said State of Georgia the tenth
day of September in the year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred
and ninety two of American Independence the Seventeenth. -
