and declare this my last Will and Testament, that
is to say, Principally and first of all I give and
recommence my soul into the hand of Almighty
God who gave it, and my body I recommend to
the earth, to be buried at the discretion of my friend,
nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection, I
shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of God - And as touching to such worldly Estate
that it has pleased God to bestow upon me in this life, I
give devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form, that is to say, I give and
bequeath to my dearly beloved Cousin & friend
Henry Bourgeois the Elder, whom I likewise
constitute, make and declare the sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament - all and
singular my Real and Personal Estate
by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed - and I
do hereby utterly disallow, Revoke and Disannul
all and every other former Testaments, Wills
Bequests, Legacies and Executors by me in any
ways before named Made and bequeathed Ratifying
and Confirming this and no other to be my
Last.

have hereunto set my hand and seal the 24th day of
September - in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and Ninety-five. —
