Memory and understanding do make my last Will
and Testament in manner and form following (that
is to say) after all my just debts and funeral expenses
are fully paid and satisfied, I give and bequeath
unto my God son John Edmund Anderson the son
of John Anderson of Louisiana afore said, and Baker
the sum of One hundred Dollars - And all the rest
residue and remainder of my Estate both real
and personal whatsoever and whosoever and of
what nature or kind soever I give devise and bequeath
the same unto my Executor hereinafter named his
Eons, Admors and assigns forever, Upon trust,
nevertheless, and to and for the only proper use
and behoof of Timothy Barnard a Mulatto
boy the son of, or reputed son of, James Barnard
deceased, his Eons, Admors and assigns forever
to be paid and delivered to him when he shall
arrive the age of twenty-one years - and the Rents,
issues and profits thereof in the mean time, to
be laid out and employed for and towards his
Clothing and education - And it is my Will and
I do desire my Executor to bind the said boy
Timothy Barnard, Apprentice to some good Mechanic
so that he may not be brought up in idleness, But
should the said Timothy Barnard happen to depart
this life, before he shall arrive at the age of
twenty-one years - Then it is my Will that the
residue of my Estate to which he would have been
intitled had he attained such age, shall go to my
God son the said John Edmund Anderson, his Eons,
Eons, Admors and assigns forever - And

And I do hereby nominate ²⁵¹constitute and appoint the said
John Anderson to be my sole Executor of this my last
Will and Testament and Guardian of the person
and Estate of the said Timothy Barnard and I do hereby
revoke and make void all former and other
Wills by me at any time heretofore made and do declare
this only to be my last Will and Testament. — M.
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the twenty-third day of December in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and ninety-six and in the twenty-
first year of American Independence. —
