and the Saw Mill and Grist Mill and all the
other buildings thereon with the appurte-
nances situate near the River Savannah
in the County of Johnston and State of South
Carolina. Also I give and bequeath to my
loving Brother William Clarke said
Master and to his assigns One hundred and
fifty Dollars to be paid as soon as it shall
be convenient for my Executors to pay the
same. Also I give and bequeath to my
beloved wife Hannah Clarke and to her
assigns all the rest and residue of my
personal Estate whatsoever whereover

Indolently Innominate and appointing said
beloved wife of Modias Clarke Executrix and
Administrator of the said City of Savannah
Merchant Executor of this my last will and
Testament hereby revoking all former Wills
and Testaments by me heretofore made In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal the fifth day of August in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
ninety three Jonathan Clarke (L).
