Chatham County the 4th of April 1792
Margaret Floyd of the State, being a person
being weak in body but of sound mind and
memory thanks be to God therefore calling to
mind the mortality of the body, do make and
ordain this my last will and Testament
that is to say principally and first of all I
give and recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that gave it and my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in
a decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my Executors nothing doubting but at
the general resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God
and as touching such worldly estate as
it has pleased God to bless me with in this
life I give demise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form
first I give and bequeath to my beloved
sons Charles Boyd, Isaac and Richard Boyd
all and singular my Land tenements
monies principal and interest of my stock
at Chatham when I do likewise make and
ordain my sole Executors of this my
last will and Testament to share & share
alike and in case of the death of my son Charles
Boyd his share must be equally divided
between his four children Mary, Charles
Estlin Allen and James. Lastly I give

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and bequeath to my son Richard Floyd all
my household furniture, other moveables
I may have after my death to be by him
freely enjoyed to his sole use and I do hereby
wholly disallow revoke, disannul, and
every other former Testaments Wills Legacies
Bequests and Executors by me in any ways
before named willed and bequeathed ratifying
and confirming this and so other to be my
last Will, Testament. I do it thus of my
free will and full power and I seal this day and
year above written

and declare this my last Will and Testament
in words and form that is to say I bequeath
I recommend my soul to the Author of its
existence. Secondly I give devise bequeath
to my Brother John Surinam all my wearing
apparel, one silver watch, and two pairs of silver
Buckles. All the rest and residue of my property
I give devise and bequeath to my good and
loving Mother Mary Surinam to her her
Heirs and Assigns forever &c &c. I do hereby
nominate constitute and appoint John Trever
of Surinam to my sole Executor thereof
ratifying and confirming this to be my
last will and Testament in the presence of
the subscribing witnesses who at my request
and in the presence of each other have
