I Mary Appollonia Nungesser of Chatham County, Widow of
the late Henry Nungesser the elder deceased, being aged & weak
in body, but of sound, perfect and disposing mind & memory praised
be God; Do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament,
that is to say first & principally of all, I most humbly recommend my
soul into the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, beseeching his
gracious acceptance through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour,
my body I recommend to the Earth, whence it was taken, in sure
& certain hopes of its resurrection to eternal life, to be buried in a
decent manner at the Discretion of my Executor hereinafter named.
Item. I devise that all my Funeral Charges & Lawful debts (if any)
be faithfully paid out of the effects of my Estate by George Nungesser
my son, whom I also, constitute, nominate, appoint, make & ordain
sole Executor, to this my last Will & Testament.

with in this life, I give devise and dispose of in the following manner and form.

First. I give and bequeath, unto George & Henry, Nungazer, my Grand Sons, by my son Henry Nungazer, deceased, and to their heirs & assigns forever my two negro Slaves named Tom & Ammaratta, and all my breeding Cattle, old Cows unfit for breeding excepted.

And I desire that untill the youngest of my Grand Sons aforesaid comes of age, no Division shall be made, but that my Son and Executor George Nungazer aforesaid shall keep the negroes and Cattle in his use & possession, untill the youngest of my said Grand children becomes of age of twenty One years, without paying anything for the use of them, and in case my Son & Executor aforesaid should happen to die, before the youngest of my Grand Sons comes of age as aforesaid, then & in that case, it is my will and desire, that the negroes & breeding Cattle, shall be kept in the possession, & for the use of his heirs, during the Minority of the youngest of my Grand Sons, by his Executors or administrators, but no longer.

Item. and further will & desires, that in case one or other of my Grand Sons, dies without lawful issue, that in that case the survivor, shall have the two negroes & breeding Cattle as aforesaid, and in case both should die, without issue then my Son & Executor George Nungazer or his heirs, shall be the heirs to this bequest.

Secondly. I give & bequeath unto my Son & Executor George Nungazer & unto his heirs & assigns, all my Male Cattle, & such old Cows, that are unfit for breeding, and my note of hand for Forty pounds due to me by James Hoastoun. Given with the last will of the

thereon, he to pay out of the same the sum of Ten pounds, as soon as the note is received unto my daughter Mary the Wife of Thomas Dowell or to her heirs.

Thirdly - I give & bequeath, unto my Daughter in Law Barbara the wife of my son & Executor George Nungesser, or to her heirs, all my wearing apparel, Bedding & Furniture.

And lastly I do hereby utterly, disavow, revoke & disannul all and every other Testament, Wills, Legacies and bequests and Executor by me in any ways before named, written & bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, this twenty second day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety one.
