In the Name of God Amen!

I, Mary Appolonia Wazeyer of Chatham County, widow of the late Henry Wazeyer the elder deceased, being aged & weak in body, but of sound, perfect and disposing mind & memory frame to God; Do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament, that is to say first & principally of all, I most humbly recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, beseeching his gracious acceptance through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour; my body I recommend to the Earth, whence it was taken, in sure & certain hopes of its resurrection to eternal life, to be buried in a decent manner at the Discretion of my Executor herein after named. Item. I desire that all my Funeral Charges, Burial debts (if any) be faithfully paid out of the effects of my Estate by George Wazeyer, my son, whom I also, constitute, nominate, appoint, make & ordain, to be Executor, to this my last Will and Testament.

with in this life, I give devise and dispose of in the following manner
and form.

First - I give and bequeath, unto George Henry Mangazeer, my
grandson, by my son Henry Mangazeer deceased, and to their heirs
successors forever my two negro slaves named Tom & Ammaretta,
and all my breeding Cattle, old Cows unfit for breeding excepted.

And I desire that until the youngest of my grandsons aforesaid
comes of age, no Division shall be made, but that my Son and
Executor George Mangazeer aforesaid shall keep the negroes and
Cattle in his use & possession, until the youngest of my said
grand children becomes of age of twenty one years, without
paying anything for the use of them, and in case my son & Executor
aforesaid should happen to die, before the youngest of my grandsons
comes of age as aforesaid, then & in that case, it is my will and desire,
that the negroes & breeding Cattle, shall be kept in the possession, b[efor]e
the use of his heirs, during the minority of the youngest of my grand
sons, by his Executor or administrators, but no longer.

Item - and further will & desire, that in case one or other of my
grand sons, dies without lawful issue, that in that case the
survivor, shall have the two negroes & breeding Cattle as -
aforesaid, and in case both should die, without issue then my
Son & Executor George Mangazeer or his heirs, shall be the
heirs to this bequest.

Secondly - I give Bequeath unto my Son & Executor George
Mangazeer unto his heirs & assigns, all my Mare Cattle, & such old
Cows, that are unfit for breeding, and my note of hand for Fifty pounds
due to me by James Roastown, Executing with the interest due

thereon, he to pay out of the same the sum of Ten pounds, as soon as
the Note is paid over unto my daughter, Mary the wife of Thomas
Dowdell or to her heirs.

Thirdly - I give & bequeath, unto my Daughter in Law Barbara the
wife of my son & Executor George Nungazer, or to her heirs, all my
wearing Apparel, Bedding & Furniture.

And lastly I do hereby utterly, disallow, revoke & disannul all and
every other Testament, Will, Legacies and bequests and Executor by me
in any ways before named, willed & bequeathed, ratifying and con-
firming this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament, in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, this twenty second day of May
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety one. —
