lished in the Gazette, and that the same would be
established according to law, at the then next Superior
Court. That at the Superior Court, due proof being made
of the publication, and no person appearing to shew any
cause against the establishment, therefore it was ordered
to be established, and to be Recorded as the original.
But in Application to the Clerk, he says the same is
not in his office to be found. The Deponent further
saith that Samuel Birrien being then Clerk to the
Deponent, did make a Copy of the said Will, which
is hereto annexed, and which the Deponent does be-
lieve to be a Copy of the Paper established by the Court, as
near as Copies usually are the same being in the hand
writing of the said Birrien, and the Deponent has
reason to believe it was examined with the original -
tho he cannot positively say it was so.
