to mind the great uncertainty of human existence - Do -
this Twentieth day of May, in the year One Thousand Seven
hundred and Ninety-Six make and publish this my last
Will and Testament - And my body I commit to the Earth
to be decently buried by and at the discretion of my Executor
herein after mentioned - And as for the worldly Estate
which it has pleased God to bless me with - I dispose of in
the following manner - First I give and bequeath to my beloved
daughters Elizabeth Doyle and Polly Tranfild the house &
One half of the Lot I now live on situated in Georgetown Street
equally between them both, but in case my daughter Elizabeth
should die without issue or Children before my two daughters
Polly and Sarah, then her proportion of the said half lot, shall
go to, and be ~~inherited~~ inherited equally between Polly and
Sarah to their heirs and assigns for ever - The other half
part of the lot I give and bequeath with the building, and
Appurtenances thereon to my loving daughter Sarah Tranfild
to her heirs and assigns forever - And I also give my Negro
Man called Tom to my daughter Sarah Tranfild to her heirs
and assigns for ever - And I likewise give her One hundred and
fifty Guineas, which I recommend her to buy a small house
with - I give to my daughter Polly Tranfild One hundred
and fifty Guineas - And I give One hundred and fifty
Guineas to my daughter Elizabeth Doyle. I give a Negro
Maid called Frickey equally between my two daughters
Polly and Elizabeth to their heirs and assigns for ever -
I give my Son John Davis fifteen pounds and Ten
shillings, the Son of Frank Davis. It is my last
Will and my wearing apparel and Household furniture
shall be equally divided between my daughters - And
I do hereby constitute and appoint Frank Davis Executor of
this

this my last Will and Testament. And do likewise appoint
him a Guardian to my daughter Sarah. —

written. —
