In the Name of God Amen, I...

Nicholas Hanner, of White Bluff, in the County of Chatham and State of Georgia, Planter, being sick and weak in Body, but of sound and perfect mind, memory and understanding. Blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, That is to say; First, it is my Will that all my just Debts, funeral Charges, and the charge of proving this my Will be paid and discharged; Then I give, Devise, and Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Hanner, formerly Elizabeth Morgan Widow, One third part of all my Estate both Real & Personal, that I may die possessed of, or be intitled to at the time of my Death of what kind or nature soever the same may consist of, To have & to hold the same, with all and singular the appurtenances, belonging, or in any wise appertaining thereto, fully & absolutely unto her the said Elizabeth Hanner my said Wife, her Heirs, and assigns forever. It is further my Will and desire, and I do hereby give and Bequeath unto my said Wife Elizabeth Hanner for and during the term of her natural life only, the free and undivided use of my Plantation whereon we now live, called Acton, with all my Houses, Cattle and other Stock, and all my Farming Utensils, and from and immediately after my death, then, it is my express will and desire, That the two thirds of my Estate both Real and Personal be sold and disposed of at Public Sale by my Executors herein after named, for the most money that can be obtained for the same, and the money arising from such sales applied, divided & disposed of as follows; To my daughter, daughter of my said wife, a sum sufficient for the purchase of a Negro Girl

Soul, and I do hereby give and Bequeath, the same unto the said
Ann Morgan, her heirs and assigns forever. And whatsoever sum
of Money may remain in the hands of my Executors from the disposal
of my Estate as aforesaid; I give and Bequeath unto Nicholas Hamner,
Catherine Simmons and Elizabeth Buckholter, to be equally di-
vided between them, share and share alike, and to their Heirs
and assigns forever. And lastly I do hereby nominate and
appoint my good Friends George Nungesser and John Coulson,
Executors of this my last Will and Testament; hereby revoking
all former Will or Wills by me at any time heretofore made
In Witnes whereof I have to this my last Will & Testament,
contained on two Pages of Paper, set my hand and seal the first
day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred
and ninety one.

County, State of Georgia Planter, being at this present of a sound mind,
do here make my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all
my former Wills. - Imprimis. I bequeath my soul to God (in
humble hopes of His mercy through the mediation of my gracious
redemer) and my body to His Earth. -

Item. - I desire that all my just debts be paid. -

Item. - I desire that a yearly annuity of seventy five pounds
sterling, out of the annual income of my Estate shall be paid to my
beloved wife Mary Demire during her life; the first payment
to be made on the first day of January next after my death, and I desire
further, that my said wife be allowed to reside at either of my Plantations,
and to enjoy the use of any articles on said Plantations afford for
the supply of the table, with an yearly allowance of seven shillings, and the
use of a horse on Church but in case of my said wife's marriage
it is my desire that she shall remove from my said Plantations, and
have no part of conversation with them, or in the business of any kind.

Item. I give and bequeath to my said wife the sum of
