Redemption.

1. After Paying my just Debts so far as the Estate of
my late Husband Israel Robison will satisfy, I do
what he possessed previous to our Marriage.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my dear beloved Son John
Lions a Certain tract of Land containing Two hundred
and Twenty Acres Situate and being on an Island in the
River Altamaha called South River opposite Governor
Whights Great Islands on the North West by Altamaha
River called Back River opposite the Governor's little Islands
on the South by fishing Creek. Also another Tract contain-
ing one hundred and fifty Acres Situate and being in the
Parish of St. John being the front of five Thousand acres
formerly Granted to Mark Carr Esq^r. Bounded West-
-only by S^d Tract, Easterly by Meroy River and on every
other side by Vacant Marshes. Also a certain Tract
Containing five hundred Acres Situate and being on
the

East by Lands laid out for the said Mark Carr and on
every other Side by Vacant Lands. Also a certain
Tract containing five hundred Acres Situate and being
on the South Side of the Altamaha River Bounded

every other Side by Marshes and Tracts

Also a certain Tract of Land containing two hundred
& fifty Acres Situate and being in the Parish of St.
Patrick Including the Islands called Crispin and Council
ed to the South by Lands of the said Mark Carr. and
on every other side by Turtle River and Marshes thereof

Also one other Tract of Land containing fifty Acres Situate
and being in the Parish of St. Patrick bounded on
every Side by Lands of the said Mark Carr.

I do Give my Beloved Son one Negro named Limrick
(notwithstanding if my Son John should Decease without
his the said Limrick to be emancipated) likewise I
Bequeath to him my Son John one riding Chair house-
hold Furniture wearing Apparel and every kind of
Personal Property except what is hereafter mentioned.

Also I Give and Bequeath unto my good and worthy
Friends Joseph Will and Mary Will a certain tract of
lands lying and being in the Parish of St. John Conta-
ining five hundred Acres Bounded North by
William Carr's Land and on all other Sides by Vacant
Land

Also, one certain Tract of Land containing five hundred Acres Situate and being in the District of Midway bounded on the East by the River Midway on the West by Land of Thomas Carr on the South by Land Tenant and on all other Sides by Marshes of the said River

Also one other Tract of Land containing two hundred Acres Situate and being between the River Midway and the Branches of the River S^r. Mathurine Bounded by the S^r. Branches and large Marshes. Also I give unto my good friend Mary Will one Green Silk Gown one White Silk Petticoat, one Red Silk Capashone

likewise, I constitute and appoint my trusty friends Mr. Joseph Will & Henry Myer my lawful Executors with full Power to act as the Law directs, making void all Wills or Instruments of Writing of this kind, ratifying and confirming this as my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and Seal dated in the City of Savannah on this first day of January, in the Year of our Lord Seventeen Hundred Sixty three and Seventeenth of American Independancy
