 I give & give to my lawful Slave a boy about three years old,
 his freedom after my decease, there are some debts due from
 me to my friends which I never was acquainted with, such as
 they may be, I desire my Executors will pay as soon as they are
 in possession of property to the amount, I desire to constitute John
 Harrison of the City of Savannah Shoemaker Robert Station
 of do. City my true and lawful Executors knowing them
 worthy of trust, & after paying all my lawful debts
 I do also bequeath unto John Harrison the whole of
 my property if any remains, In Witness whereof
 I have set my hand & seal this 5 day of September, 1800
