I William Jordan now of the State aforesaid, but late of Georgia planter, being of sound mind and memory do constitute this my last Will and Testament in manner following, that is to say, I direct all my ~~debt~~ just debts to be paid, which being done I affix my signature and direct the disposition of my Estate as follows;

First I commit my Estate real and personal to the care & trust of my Executor hereafter mentioned, for the following purposes, secondly I direct my Executor hereafter mentioned to keep my Estate real & personal in his possession, subject nevertheless to the payment of my just debts, during the natural life of my Brother James Jordan, to whom I direct the payment out of the income of my Estate of Fifty pounds Sterling Pannum during his natural life, and I also direct the sum of Ten pounds Sterling Pannum to each of my Sister, Mary Timmon's children.

But if the income of my Estate should be more, than the above annuities I direct the surplus to be paid annually to my Brother James Jordan and my Sister Mary Timmon's children share and share alike in addition to the above annual legacies.

Thirdly upon the demise of my Brother James Jordan, I direct my Executor (all my just debts being paid) to divide all my real & personal Estate between I amongst the surviving children above mentioned of my Sister, Mary Timmon's share & share alike. Lastly I constitute & appoint my Friend Plowden Weston, Esq: planter, of the State of South Carolina my sole Executor to this my last will & Testament,
