I William Crivellier of Sacoet in
France at Present residing in Savannah in
the State of Georgia Being though weak in
body and suffering under sore affliction yet
being of perfect sound and disposing mind
memory and understanding and considering
the uncertainty of this transitory life do
make this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following that is to say
First according to the ancient good and
laudable Custom which my Heart and
understand^{ing} doth require this I be

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bequeath my land to her hoping for her
 share through the only child of her land
 William. I want that my body I desire to be
 buried in a decent Christian burial at the dis-
 cretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned
 in all humble prayer that I may have a
 Part in the Resurrection of the just and
 as to the worldly property which it has
 pleased god to bestow on me after all my
 past debts & Financial expenses are fully
 paid and satisfied I do by this my last
 and only will, devise leave and bequeath
 unto Desire Lambert and Paul Dupon
 and the survivor of them and the heirs Ex-
 ecutors and administrators of each survivor
 to hold in trust for all slaves Louisa, Maria
 called Zilia a free woman of colour and
 her four children named Ephraim, Isaac,
 Joseph alias Marie Collette and Francis
 & Pierre as a reward for her kindness and
 affluence to man my other and for other
 god and laudable reasons the following
 negro slaves to wit: Ananias, Francis,
 Charlotte, Justine and Aglae being four in
 number together with their husbands married
 and wives of the female I want to hold the
 land to me and their heirs and heirs forever
 also the two tenements belonging to me on the
 lot the property of all the children in Bay and
 Mount together with all the household fur-
 niture therein belonging to me also the
 unpaid term of the Lease for the lot
 whereon the said houses or tenements stand
 to hold to them her said trustees

purposed before mentioned (as per or as long)
 as the said child exists
 Charles and bequeath certain Bill of
 Exchange drawn by Samuel D. Dupon on
 the tenth day of August 1800 on Handers
 and sons by Value out of the Brown of Phila-
 delphia in my favor for the sum of Two
 thousand six hundred and twenty five dol-
 lars (which said Bill of Exchange has been
 protested for non payment) Also a set
 of hand signed by Laurence and payable
 to my order dated the tenth day of June
 Eighteen Hundred and Five for the sum
 of Eighteen Hundred and Fifty Dollars and
 Eighty nine Cents, the payment of which
 said note is secured by a Mortgage and
 which has also been protested for non payment
 to be applied by my Executors hereafter
 mentioned when required in manner and
 form following that is to say to my Grand-
 Desire Lambert and Paul Dupon or assigns
 Eight hundred dollars to be equally di-
 vided between them the residue I bequeath
 as follows one half thereof to the said Desire
 Lambert and Paul Dupon and the survivor
 of them and the Executors and admin-
 istrators of each survivor In trust for the
 only use and behoof of all slaves Louisa, Ma-
 rie, called Zilia and her children Eph-
 raime, Isaac and the heirs forever
 and the other half or remainder to the in-
 heritors Lambert and Paul Dupon as afore-
 said the least for my last wishes in
 the year or such of them as my be long

and signed to be my last will &
testament this 1st day of May
in the year of our said Lord
King the first Trade Union in presence
of the following witnesses who all
are men and in my presence and
in the presence of each other did we
subscribe these names here to

In addition to the
 foregoing soils and before the same be used

buried in the same place as he was

will be able to visit me soon. I am
