Fourthly, I give all the rest of my plate household & kitchen
furniture, beds headsteads & bedding to my beloved wife Sarah and
wish she may divide the plate between her & my daughters Sarah
Bullock wife of M^r. Arch^r. Stobo Bullock or give her a full equiv-
alent thereof. Fifthly, I give, devise and bequeath the use of

all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate real & personal to
my said beloved Wife Sarah during her Widowhood. And in case
she should intermarry after my decease (which I think she has no propen-
sity to do having so large a family of children) it is my will that
my ¹⁹¹ property be equally divided between her and all my children as my

be and that my said estate be sold by my Executors hereafter named
in favor of the said poor that cannot may be had for the same either in
or out of the said or my Executors may think most advantageous
to my said wife and children and that the money arising from the
sale thereof be equally divided between her & my said children, but
in case my said wife should not intermarry & give assurance to
the contrary of all my said estate real and personal what-
soever & whatsoever and herein before disposed of to her my said
wife during her life and after & after her decease I give, devise
and bequeath the same to & among all my children and to their
respective heirs Executors Administrators and assigns to be
equally divided between them share & share alike. Lastly
I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said before
said John G. Howell & my much beloved father in Law
Capt. John G. Howell my Executors in and George Jones
Capt. my two sons James and George Glan & the Survivors
and survivors of them Executors of this my last will and
testament hereby revoking all former written Wills by
me at any time heretofore made. In Witness whereof
