hand and seal this 1st day of January 1841

I have and bequeath my Soul to the Lord in Christ and
to His Holy Spirit of a Resurrection, as to my Body I
Bequeath to my dear wife and all my just debts and personal
Charges to be paid, and the residue of my personal
Estate and estate to be distributed among my children to be
divided equally among them

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named Person the Person or Persons so refusing shall forfeit his or their Bequest or Legacy which shall be equally divided between the other Legatee named in this Will.

The Monies arising from the sale of my real and personal Estate drawn to be sold after paying all my debt and a Settlement of the Estate shall be put at Interest by my Executor in such manner as shall enable them to pay £400⁰⁰ the first be agreeable to the Tenor of this Will.

I Bequeath To Mr J^{rs} Spencer my sword Hoping he will never disgrace it more than from that I bequeath it. He has been a Companion with him during the American Revolution.

And lastly I make certain Constitutions Nominate and appoint My Brother William Henry Spencer and My Nephew William Joseph Spencer & Samuel Spencer his Brother my Executors to this my last Will & Testament and I do hereby utterly revoke & dissolve & disallow every other former Will & Testaments or Legacies Bequests & Executors by me in any manner or way before named Willed or Bequeathed ratifying & confirming this and all other to be my last Will and Testament.

In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal this day of And in the Year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and In the Year of the Independence of America & In Presence of the Subscribing Witnesses

This I intend if not prevented to Execute as my Will Drawn this 10th Dec^r 1815.

own discretion for ever the above sum to be paid out
of Money arising from the sales of such Property
as shall hereafter be seized the above sum to be paid
directly into his hands & he and his producing his
papers to the Executors for examination.

of William Ingham after which should a surplus remain
on Land I will that One hundred Dollars be paid to
my Niece Anne when she shall attain of the
Legislator for. Ransom for ever

I will never that my Executors at the publishing
of the Legislature after my death proper a Petition and
then every year to obtain the Transcription of
March 1800 that my Executors call on all Legates
Parties &c who are interested in this Will to my last
to sign the above named Petition & should any be
unconvinced as aforesaid, respect to sign the above
Petition.

aforesaid Personally appeared Foreman Cuyler who

 Life time, and with his handwriting and that he
 acerbly believes the foregoing Instrument of Writing
 purporting to be the last Will & Testament of the said

 of 19th Dec^r 1805 is to the best of this deponents belief
 the proper Signature of the said John Spencer deceased
