I John Storer of the city of Savannah Taylor being of a sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make my last will and testament in manner and form following (shalters to say) whereas moved by a certain indenture of Lease and Release the release bearing date the twenty seventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty one and made between me the said John Storer and Margaret my wife of the one part and William Stephens and David Bryson, Mitchell Esquires of the other part I the said John Storer and Margaret my wife did for the consideration therein mentioned grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the said William Stephens and David Bryson Mitchell and to their heirs and assigns forever all that Lots of land there situate in my possession known by the number two in the third Township which were in the city of Savannah aforesaid containing sixty feet in front and thirty in depth together with buildings improvements and appurtenances thereto belonging To hold to the said William Stephens and David Bryson Mitchell their heirs and assigns forever upon trust and to and for the use of the said Margaret my wife for and during the term of her natural life and after her death then the said Premises to be divided equally between the said

and the one half of the said purchase money be paid to said Stephen
as the said Margaret shall by deed or will previously made or appoint
and in default thereof to her right heirs from and the other half of such
purchase money to and among the right heirs of and the said John Stearns
or to such persons or persons as they shall think meet or appoint to receive
and take the same as by the said in part recited indenture of lease
and Release reference being thereunto had with more fully appears
Now it is my will and I do hereby direct the said William Stephens
and David Brydie Mitchell their heirs or assigns to pay all the said
half part of the said purchase money only the said indenture of
release assigned and left at my disposal unto Archibald Clerk
the son of my said wife by her former husband to the proper use of
the said Archibald Clerk whom I do hereby appoint to receive
and take the same as by the said indenture of release I am empowered.
And if the said Archibald Clerk shall depart this life before he shall
attain the age of twenty one years at which time and not before he shall
repay the said money & the interest thereof in the mean time herein to
be applied to the use of the said money it is my will that the said half of the
said purchase money shall go to and be divided among my right heirs
of equal degree and their heirs and assigns and I do hereby give
donate and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my estate
real and personal whatsoever and whosoever unto my said wife
Margaret said I do nominate constitute and appoint the said William
Stephens and David Brydie Mitchell Executors of my said Margaret

signed with by me at any time heretofore made I do declare that only the
