to hold the said two Negro women together with their future issue and
increase and all such other estate as above mentioned unto my said son his
executors administrators and assigns forever but should my said son happen
to depart this life before he shall arrive at the age of majority when it is
with that all my said estate shall immediately after his decease forthwith
become the absolute property of Dorcas Poole one of John Poole of Savannah
aforesaid equal his executors administrators and assigns forever and lastly I
have constituted and appointed the said John Poole executor of that my
will and testament and guardian of the person and estate of my said son Sam-
Shelly and revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made I do
this only to be my last will and testament The witnesses whereof I have
hereunto set my hand at seat at Savannah aforesaid the ninth day of
December in the year of our Lord one thousand and seven hundred and eighty
six
